ORDER

Petitioner was convicted of murder, attempted murder, and armed robbery and was sentenced to death. This Court affirmed his convictions and sentences. *State v. Jenkins*, Op. No. 28089 (S.C. Sup. Ct. filed April 6, 2022) (Howard Adv. Sh. No. 12 at 46). The petition for rehearing was denied on June 7, 2022.

Petitioner now requests a stay of execution to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in the United States Supreme Court. The State, by way of return, concedes a stay of execution is appropriate under *In re Stay of Execution in Capital Cases*, 321 S.C. 544, 471 S.E.2d 140 (1996).

Because Petitioner intends to raise to the United States Supreme Court a federal question that is preserved for review, we grant the petition for stay of execution. *Id.* The stay shall remain in effect to the extent provided by this Court in *In re Stays of Execution in Capital Cases*, *supra*.
