Dear Dr. Faltas:

On June 13, 2022, the Court sent you a deficiency letter asking for a proof of service for the motion to appoint counsel. To date, we have not received a correction. Accordingly, no further action will be taken on your motion.

On June 10, 2022, the Supreme Court issued an order clarifying the limited instances in which you may file documents in the Unified Judicial System of South Carolina. Specifically, the order states that you "may file any document [you] are required to file in any criminal proceeding in which [you are] a defendant not represented by counsel." Our records reflect you are required to correct the following outstanding deficiency in your notice of appeal, as required by the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR) and this Court's letter dated March 25, 2022:

- A proof of service has not been provided as required by Rule 262, SCACR. You must serve and file a proof of service substantially in the format shown by Form 7 in Appendix C to part II of the SCACR.

Failure to correct the deficiency within ten (10) days of the date of this letter will result in dismissal of your appeal.
