ORDER

Pursuant to Rule 222 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules, the motion for costs filed by respondent is granted in the amount of \$1,248.89 against appellant. The clerk of the circuit court is directed to add this award of costs to the remittitur as provided by Rule 222(e).

In the motion for costs, respondent asks for an "order requiring Appellant to remit one thousand (\$1,000.00) to the Respondent to cover the attorneys' fees incurred in responding to this appeal and to reimburse the Respondent for two hundred forty-eight and 89/100 dollars (\$248.89) that Respondent incurred in costs on this appeal." To the extent that respondent may be asking for an order compelling appellant to pay these amounts, that request is denied. Instead, the award made above should be enforced in the circuit court like any other judgment.
