




ORDER


In the explanation required by Rule 243(c) of South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), Petitioner has failed to show that there is an arguable basis for asserting that the determination by the lower court was improper. Accordingly, this matter is dismissed. The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b), SCACR. In addition, Petitioner has filed a motion to proceed in forma pauperis, a motion to appoint counsel, a motion for leave to file fewer copies of the appendix than is required by the Appellate Court Rules, a motion to remand the matter and hold the case in abeyance, a motion for judicial notice of the lack of an Appendix, a motion for assistance in acquiring audio recordings of his annual review from the South Carolina Department of Corrections, and a motion to compel the lower courts to consider additional motions filed by Petitioner. The motions are denied as moot.
