To Whom It May Concern,

I am hereby requesting a Writ of Certiorari from the Supreme Court (review of my case) that was turned down by the lower courts; as I am not satisfied & felt I was treated unfairly with this decision of the lower courts regarding DEU, The Little River Medical Center.

Your office advised me that since is a new case that I did not have to send you my whole file; but will give you a briefing:

Based on Code Ann 41.35 120(1) I was declared my unemployment because it appears that I "voluntarily quit without good cause."

This definitely was not the case. When I knew because of my parents medical problems that I was going to have to relocate & find a new job my HR Department at Little River Medical Center was on "remote" due to COVID & we were advised at that time that any/all issues that would have gone to HR was to be brought to our immediate supervisor which I did. I told her the whole story which she was well aware of as well as all the other employees & she advised me to "just send an email to HR telling them that I was leaving" which I did. Not at any time did anyone said to send medical proof (all of the attached medical info. was put right on DEW's website when I had to show proof. This situation has all been explained many times through DEW & when I made appeals.

When I arrived in Bolivia Springs I immediately sought employment. It was never my intention nor to

work again even though it was imperative that me (my family) were all together & I was to help them now with their disabilities which was just getting worse by the day (Pls see doctor Judith Hughes letters that were given to DEW immediately & then to the Appellate Court).



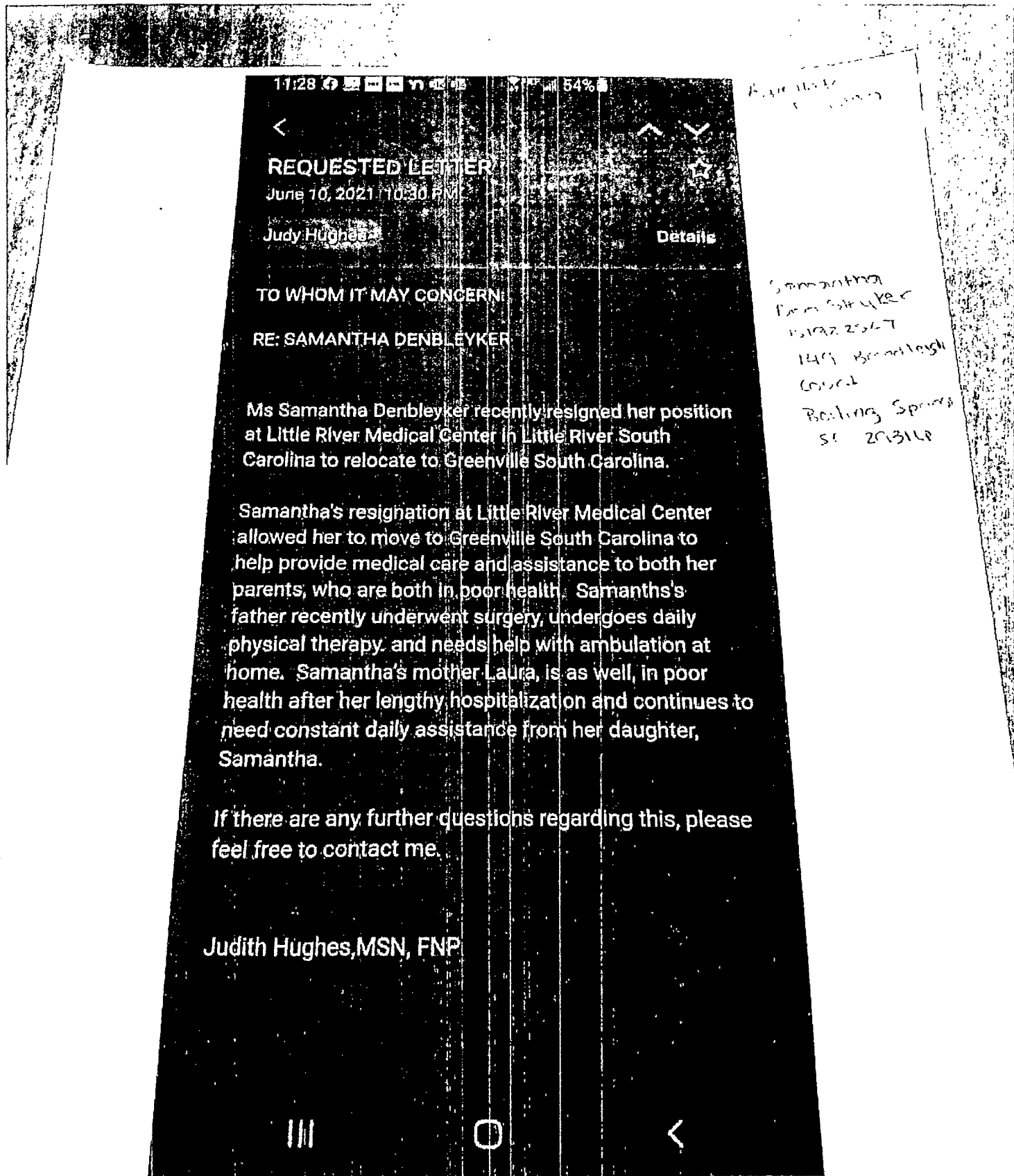

The Claimant, Samantha M. Denbleyker, as well as her mother have been patients of mine since 2005. Samantha lives with her mother, both residing in Little River, SC. Her mother became gravely ill early 2021, hospitalized with severe hypoxia, COPD and Emphysema. She is currently on oxygen, as well as other inhalation treatments to help with her breathing. She also had left hip replacement, now needs the right hip replaced. She ambulates with a walker in the home. She is chronically ill, weak and her medical needs are many. Samantha, her mother and father have given me, their provider, permission to reveal some of her medical conditions to satisfy this Appellate Panel Decision, without violating their HIPPA Patient rights.

Ms Samanta Denbleyker's father resides in Boiling Springs, SC. Approximately the same time Mrs. Denbleyker was released from the hospital for hip surgery, it was discovered that Mr. Denbleyker had a neurological problem in his spine requiring surgical intervention. He as well ambulates with a walker. He was also found to have a serious chronic cardiac issue requiring complicated cardiovascular surgery, limiting his ability to help with anything in and around the house.

Ms Denbleyker's decision to relocate to Boiling Spring with her mother, to continue the care for both chronically ill parents was a distressing decision she had to make. Samantha Denbleyker enjoyed working at Little River Medical Center as is obvious by her 38+ year tenure. I know her to be an honest, truthful person, who always abided by management decisions. If she was told to report her departure from Little River Medical Center, she would have done just as required.

I ask the Appellate Panel to re-examine Ms. Denbleyker's case and find in her favor. This is a daughter who cares enough of her chronically ill parents to take on the role as their caregiver. Unfortunately, there are not many like Ms. Denbleyker willing to do this today.

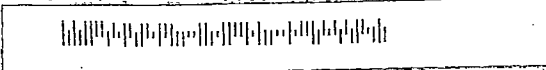
