MOTION FOR WAIVER OF FILING FEE

Pursuant to Ex parte Martin v. the State 321 S.C. 533, 471 S.E.2d 134 decided by the South Carolina Supreme Court 5 May 1995, the Appellant ask the court to waive the filing fee since the service regarding this cause of action concerns her fundamental right to due process of law and equal protection of law guaranteed by the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments of the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of South Carolina, Art. 1, §3.

The Appellant was not served at the Hunter Estate, on either 6th or 7th of October 2021, as a writ of ejectment was issued against her and she filed an appeal in the S.C. Court of Appeals. Rather, the Appellant was served at the Sumter County Magistrate Court by the Civil Clerk, Carla Brayboy. Pursuant to SCRMC Rule 6(i), the lower court was required to amend the process and enter proof of service when it decided to use court personnel for service in the complaint unrelated to the writ of ejectment. Then the court allowed Brayboy to knowingly mail the Magistrate Summons for a 8 December 2021 hearing to an incorrect address when it knew the last known address on file was different. The right of the Appellant to be heard, to file an answer, and counterclaim was flagrantly disregarded
