

ORDER

Petitioner has filed what we construe as a petition for a writ of certiorari. Because Petitioner failed to file a petition for rehearing from the Court of Appeals' order and because the remittitur was sent pursuant to Rule 221 of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR), Petitioner's petition for a writ of certiorari is stricken and dismissed. *See* Rule 242(a), SCACR (providing this Court will only review a final decision of the Court of Appeals); Rule 242(c), SCACR (providing a decision is not final for the purposes of review until a petition for rehearing or reinstatement has been acted on by the Court of Appeals); *Stogsdill v. S.C. Dep't of Health & Human Servs.*, 415 S.C. 568, 784 S.E.2d 669 (2016) (stating the sending of the remittitur ends appellate jurisdiction over a case).
