

ORDER

In Appellate Case Number 2019-001193, the South Carolina Court of Appeals denied the petition for a writ of certiorari in this post-conviction relief (PCR) case. Petitioner has now filed a *pro se* petition for a writ of certiorari to review the decision of the Court of Appeals, along with a motion to relieve his counsel.

In *Ellison v. State*, 382 S.C. 189, 676 S.E.2d 671 (2009), this Court determined that it will no longer entertain petitions for writs of certiorari where the Court of Appeals has denied a petition for a writ of certiorari in a PCR case.

Accordingly, the petition for a writ of certiorari is dismissed. Further, the motion to relieve counsel is denied as moot.
