I will inform you of my case which ultimately now morphs into one which I am challenging the inequity which results in South Carolina's Post-Conviction Relief process and procedures. My case is currently in the South Carolina Supreme Court with a pending Rule 59(e) motion. The case is *Alonzo C. Jeter, III, v State of South Carolina*, Appellate Case No. 2022-000750.


Please do not misconstrue this correspondence to you as an attempt to have you rule on the merits of this case. I am simply attempting to make you aware of the case and also offer you proofs and to reveal to you the handwriting on the wall. My Due Process rights which are guaranteed by the United States Constitution, are trampled on in this state. There are many others like myself, I am simply an inmate who is somewhat able to articulate this to you and provide hard proof and truths.

Today I issue a challenge to you. I challenge you to find one (1) single post-conviction relief case where the proper standard with regard to motions for summary judgment has been used by the common pleas courts. This would be the scintilla standard. There exists no PCR case in which the court's order grants or denies summary judgment discusses this proper standard as the courts have continuously erred in failing to base its determination on this standard.

I could provide more examples of inequities in the PCR process, however, I will opt not to at this time in the interest of respect for your time and attention. If, on the other hand you take a look and find me interesting, there is more things you may find quite interesting located in another case in which I am litigating pro se. See the case of *Alonzo C. Jeter, III, v State of South Carolina*, Appellate Case No. 2017-001777, currently pending in the South Carolina Court of Appeals.
