



ORDER

By order dated September 14, 2022, this Court dismissed the present matter on the ground that Petitioner failed to show there was an arguable basis for asserting that the determination by the lower court was improper pursuant to Rule 243(c), SCACR. Petitioner has now filed a petition for rehearing of that decision. Petitioner has also filed a motion to strike his original explanation filed pursuant to Rule 243(c), SCACR, and file a supplemental explanation. After careful consideration of the petition for rehearing, the Court is unable to discover that any material fact or principle of law has been either overlooked or disregarded. Therefore, there is no basis for granting a rehearing. *See* Rule 221(a), SCACR (providing a petition for rehearing must state with particularity the points supposed to have been overlooked or misapprehended by the Court). Accordingly, the petition for rehearing is denied. The motion to strike is denied as moot.
