CONSENT MOTION TO EXTEND TIME TO FILE INITIAL BRIEF AND
DESIGNATION OF MATTER

Appellant, with the consent of Respondent, respectfully moves this Court to extend the time for filing the initial brief and designation of matter by 10 days.

Counsel had a motions deadline on November 1, 2022, in a federal murder case (*United States v. Trevor Seward*, 4:20-cr-512-DCC) and is currently number 2 on the Greenville County General Sessions trial docket for November 7, 2022 (*State v. Xavier Concepcion*).
