Dear Judge Few,

It is an honor to write to you. My letter is of course related to my case, however not about any decision made in respects to it. I am hoping my letter would encourage change.

Ever since March 11, 2013 I have been trying to understand the heart of man. As I read the Constitution, I see what the intent is/was. My summation is that it guides the lawmakers and law enforcers while encouraging, peace and enforcing the rights of man that God has already given. If one were to understand, respect, abide and live to be empowered by

him/herself, law would not seem to be so harsh. As a Sovereign Citizen and a family woman, I live to inspire others. There are no perfect persons, laws etc. So I don't hold man to a high expectation.

However, I do feel others are accountable for their actions. That even governs myself. The last past months I have gone to bed to wake up being thankful that I am alive. I had a bad scare, my mental health shut my body down. I am still at the mercy of God. It is in the moments when we are introduced to our purpose driven lives. Its when religion matters most. It is the introduction of Forgiveness and Love. It is the challenge of ones love for God, to love those who spitefully hurt or use you. My family and I have been crushed. As of this day I have not told them the whole truth. The acts were too equivoal to share and my

We have experienced one death after the other and thus would be too much of a burden. For years I would ask myself and others "Who am I". An answer was always distant. When you try to help so much and can help through your pain, it becomes more and more clear. I gave my life to God so my first answer would be, a child of God. It is good to take something in every experience to better yourself and or be a testimony to others. Unfortunately, my pain is so deep this will take time. However I really want to help others. No one in this state or in any other should ever experience what I have. Being thrown out on the streets in public and wrongfully so, is something I would never want for an enemy. It is inhumane. Why do we run to the aide

Of natural disasters, but we cause our own
man made disasters. I have read many laws
and rules for our country and others. As I read
it, it is time for change. My family
endured 10 hrs of humiliation and many
Civil Rights Violations "Color of Law". While
police officers watched. My husband and 2
70 year old in laws braved it all while
watching our lives be destroyed. How does an
eviction lead to death and destruction?
All of our companions (17 age 2mo-7yrs) are
dead and our property destroyed. 10 minutes
before a State Senator who is also an
attorney called and asked Lt. Bafter to hold
off. He told him I had 2 hearings and
that I was stealing. I know it will take
more than legislators to help me in this
matter. Why? As hard as he tried he was
over powered by the authority being in

the wrong persons hand. I hope a law can be passed for emergency situations. I hope the law will look closer at evictions and the process of the Sheriff Departments. I hope the law looks closer at the judges and attorneys who violate the law. That day should not have happened. These Officers woke up just to do what they did. They harassed us all weekend, yes even Sunday. Just before Lt Baxter cut the lock, he said yesterday was your day and today is mine. How can anyone take pride in causing homelessness? How can an entire civil team just watch, while being paid on tax payers money. There is no decision that will ever be made that will us break my heart. There can be one to make sure no other hearts are broken.

The sad part about it all, is no one has called to apologize. Lt Baxter is in my opinion unqualified to wear any badge of law. He is not a role model for any future citizen who chooses to follow. He is not one of the ones who would ever be honored, he is unlike those who would give their life to help or save another. I understand we will never have a perfect government. That doesn't mean we shouldn't try to come close.

My battle is not over, it has only just begun. I hope you will consider the law/rules on courtion for this state. I hope my experience encourages others to be empowered to try the Constitution on their own by effecting their rights as Citizens of the United States. No one man should have that much power. If a Senator calls, I believe he should be respected. Just to think, if he was, the

outcome would have been different. The mere fact that an officer of 13 yrs civil process does not know how to read paperwork that would determine legal or not is absurd. He knew the paperwork was wrong. I knew what they were doing was wrong. There was no one to stop them. How can that be? They have violated so much that I could not file to be put back in possession. They destroyed everything. Although I am honored to have filed for any help in your courts, I am concerned that I had to. This did not need to go that far. It speaks for the character of our state judicial system. There is hope at the Top. Now we need the bottom to follow. I don't know my future, I am just trying to forget my past. It feels like a deep rut and it is crippling at times. I am just happy to see another

day. I have been in and out of the hospital.
I am pushing to want to go on. Please help
this state by not allowing these man made
disasters. The next person may not have a
strong will to continue. As strong as I
thought I was, I gave up. This has to be
addressed, somehow. somehow, somehow.
All I do is in memory of 17 lives gone for
nothing.
