ORDER

Appellant filed a motion seeking clarification of this Court's order filed November 17, 2022. After careful consideration, the following portion of the order is hereby rescinded:

Third, Appellant's motion for leave to file, receive, and serve filings by e-mail is granted to the limited extent that the only address Appellant may send filings to is ctappfilings@sccourts.org. Appellant may use this email address only to file appropriate appellate documents and may not otherwise email any member of this court or its staff.

Order dated Sept. 27, 2017 (requiring Appellant to make filings in writing via hand-delivery or U.S. mail, if pro se filings are permitted); *In the Matter of Marie Assa'ad Faltas*, S.C. Sup. Ct. Order dated June 10, 2022 (prohibiting Appellant from filing any document in any form in any court in this State and creating a narrow exception to permit Appellant to file "any document she is required to file in any criminal proceeding in which she is a defendant not represented by counsel").

Appellant's request for permission to serve opposing counsel by e-mail is denied. Appellant must make any filings she is required to serve and file either by U.S. mail or hand-delivery.
