This Motions arises out of an order of the South Carolina Workers' Compensation Commission for the dates of August 3, 2022, and September 7, 2022. Although, the case is currently under Judicial Review, the Appellant wish to show cause that intervention/oversight of the South Carolina Court of Appeals is warranted and is necessary.

It has been brought the attention of the Appellant that South Carolina Workers' Compensation has been re-directing funds for the past 2 years that was supposed to be given to the Appellant. Commissioner Scott Beck award the Defendant's Liberty Mutual a credit of \$24,098.00 for overpayment and never reported it to Social Security Administration. Then, the Commissioner approved for the Defendant's to discontinue the Appellant's Temporary Total Disability payments. The SC Commission has continued to report to the Federal Government and Social Security Administration for past 2 years that they were still making those payments to the Appellant. In addition to the work-related injury that is now multiple Occupational Diseases that the Appellant is suffering from by the Workers Compensation physician's and the initial injury from the Builders First Source, the Appellant is trying to endure the financial losses of \$83,590.16 from the re-direction of Workers Compensation funds and them falsely reporting to Social Security and the Federal Government that the Appellant was receiving those funds. Because of these entities' actions, even though I have been approved to receive Disability Benefits; SSA has temporarily suspended benefits until April or May 2023. The Appellant has acquiesced to the decisions of Workers' Compensation and has adhered to each request to supply proof to all the fraudulent actions that has been done to the Appellant, sadly to no avail.

The Appellant begs for relief, by means of action on the part of the Court of Appeals to intervene, provide oversight and/ or rule to have this case be heard before a higher court to render a fair decision.

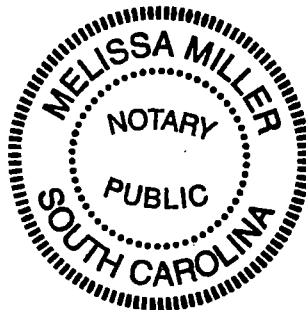
