

Tyrone Moore with this Court on November 30, 2022. Counsel filed the brief of respondent and designation of matter in the case of The State v. Joey Corvell Reid with this Court on November 28, 2022. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Jaelon Jackson v. The State with the Supreme Court on November 10, 2022. Counsel, with lead counsel Robert M. Dudek and co-counsel Lara M. Caudy, filed the brief of petitioner in the death penalty case of Marion Alexander Lindsey v. The State with the Supreme Court on November 4, 2022.

3. This request is made in good faith, and not for purposes of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.


