NOW COMES Respondent/Appellant City of Charleston, by and through its undersigned counsel, expressly joined by and with the consent of Respondent/Appellant National Trust for Historic Preservation in the United States (collectively, “Respondents/Appellants”), pursuant to Rule 263(b), SCACR,¹ and moves for an extension of fifteen (15) days’ additional time for Respondents/Appellants to petition for rehearing of this matter, which the Court decided via opinion filed February 1, 2023.

Presently, by order of this Court filed February 17, 2023, the deadline to petition for rehearing is March 3, 2023. Because of work-related and other time commitments, the Court’s allowance of fifteen (15) days’ additional time for Respondents/Appellants to petition for rehearing is requested. It is respectfully submitted that there is good cause for the Court to grant the relief requested herein, as it is, under the circumstances, a reasonable dispensation, timely sought, consistent with the interests of justice, posing no threat of undue prejudice to any other party.

By the undersigned’s calculations, the granting of this relief would make the new deadline to petition for rehearing Monday, March 20, 2023.² ADDITIONALLY, for the same reasons set forth in support of the within request for an extension of time, it is requested that the Court hold the present deadline for Respondents/Appellants to petition for rehearing in abeyance until the Court acts on this motion.
