**MOTION FOR FOURTH EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE
INITIAL BRIEF OF RESPONDENT AND
DESIGNATION OF MATTER**

The undersigned counsel would respectfully request a thirty (30) day extension in which to file the Initial Brief of Respondent in the above-referenced case. Counsel for Appellant has consented to all extension request through March 31, 2023. In support of this motion, counsel would respectfully show the Court the following:

Respondent's Initial Brief and Designation of Matter are due today, March 6, 2023 as per this Court's Order dated February 6, 2023 granting Respondent's third extension request. The undersigned attorney for the Respondent has had a number of state and federal matters to attend since February 6, 2023. Specifically,

1. Counsel has been reviewing matters due to his involvement as Chairman on the Office of the Attorney General's Appellate Decision Review Committee. The Committee was formed to review all adverse decisions in Capital, Federal Habeas, Direct Appeals, and Post-Conviction Relief matters, and to determine whether the State will appeal these rulings. In the

last thirty days, counsel has reviewed the following matters: Vasiliy Chernyak v. State of South Carolina, a Spartanburg County Post-Conviction Relief matter; Gabriel Rios v. State of South Carolina, a Spartanburg County Post-Conviction Relief matter; Cary Ryals v. State of South Carolina, a Berkeley County Post-Conviction Relief matter, and State of South Carolina v. Kenneth Lamont Robinson, a Charleston County murder direct appeal.

2. Counsel prepared and filed the Return and Memorandum of Law in Support of Motion for Summary Judgment in the matter of Anthony Lounds v. Warden Charles Williams, C/A No. 2:22-cv-3272-TMC-MGB on February 6, 2023;

3. Counsel prepared and filed the Status Report in the matter of James D. Robertson v. Jon Ozmint, C/A No. 2:11-cv-00063-TMC-MGB on February 9, 2023;

4. Counsel prepared and submitted a proposed Order Denying Applicant's Rule 59(e) Motion in the matter of James D. Robertson v. State of South Carolina on February 28, 2023, a capital PCR action pending in the York County Court of Common Pleas; and

5. Further, counsel has done a substantial amount of research for the issues in the matter of The State of South Carolina v. Nathaniel Rowland, Appellate Case No: 2021-000822, a Richland County direct appeal matter which is currently due to be filed with this Court on or before March 13, 2023.

Additionally, counsel has been limited in the ability to work to ill health and a series of cardiac testing order over the last few weeks. Counsel was out of the office on sick leave February 23-27, 2023, and continues to have limited ability to work at the present time. Counsel in consultation with the supervisor of the unit has secured the assistance of another attorney in the unit to address the issues presented in this direct appeal and to file the initial brief of respondent within the time requested in this motion or with limited further extension.

WHEREFORE, counsel respectfully requests a thirty (30) day extension of time to serve and file the Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter. This request is made in good faith for all the reasons outlined above and not for the purposes of delay.


