
1. The petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in this case are due to be served and filed today.
2. Counsel filed the Johnson petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of James E. Kennedy v. State on Tuesday, May 21, 2013. Counsel filed the brief of

petitioner in the case of State v. Eric Dantzler on Monday, May 13, 2013. On Wednesday, May 8, 2013, counsel had an oral argument in the case of State v. Antwan McMillan. On Monday, May 6, 2013, counsel had an oral argument in the case of State v. Travell Hill. On Wednesday, May 1, 2013, counsel filed the Anders brief of appellant and record on appeal in the case of State v. Jacqueline Yvette Sullivan, and the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Johnny Frazier v. State the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Robert L Foster v. State. On Monday, April 29, 2013, Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Jimmy Littlejohn v. State. 


