

ORDER

By order dated March 13, 2023, this Court dismissed the present matter on the ground that Petitioner failed to timely serve and file the petition for a writ of certiorari pursuant to Rule 243(b), SCACR. Petitioner has now filed a "Motion to Reconsider the Dismissal of the Petitioner's Matters." After careful consideration of the petition for rehearing, the Court is unable to discover that any material fact or principle of law has been either overlooked or disregarded. Therefore, there is no basis for granting a rehearing. *See* Rule 221(a), SCACR (providing a petition for rehearing must state with particularity the points supposed to have been overlooked or misapprehended by the Court). Accordingly, the petition for rehearing is denied.
