Ms. Kitchings,

I am in receipt of your May 4th letter informing the parties that they must file and serve their Final Briefs within 10 days of the date of your letter (i.e., May 14th). However, respondent already missed their deadline for filing their Final Brief. As you are well aware, there was no stay in force in this appeal so respondent cannot be given another opportunity to file their Final Brief late, absent a court order. Further, I have already timely filed and served my Final Brief so I should not be required to do that which I have already done.
