I am in receipt of your May 4th letter informing the parties that Respondent missed their filing deadline for their Initial Brief and Designation of Matter but then you give them 10 more days to file those two documents. This is not a situation which can be cured by sending a letter to the parties. After a deadline is missed, a **motion** to the Court to get their judicial determination **is required**.
