

Pro Se response to writ of certiorari

First, I would like to point out that my forensic psych. evaluations stated that I was, at the time of the crime, unable to legally confirm my actions, and my counsel should have had me sign a guilty but insane plea, garnering a lesser sentence.

Second, being a military veteran, when I am given a form to sign by someone who I deem authoritative, I generally sign it without question. The GBMI plea was not discussed with me prior to the day of the hearing. I did not understand what I was signing.

Finally, the fact that my counsel was, in my honest opinion, ineffective in his counsel and therefore, I do believe a post conviction relief is in order.
