FIRST MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE
RULE 242(d), SCACR DOCUMENTS

Counsel for Mr. Robertson requests a thirty-day extension of time to file the documents specified in Rule 242(d). Counsel were appointed on May 17, 2023 making the due date Monday, June 19, 2023. If granted this first request would result in a due date of Wednesday, July 19, 2023.

Since May 17, 2023, counsel has been actively involved in jury trial cases including three in the United States District Court which are subject to time constraints as set forth by Congress in the Speedy Trial Act, 18 U.S.C. § 3161(h)(7)(B)(iv). There is an unresolved motion pending before this Court pertaining

to Mr. Robertson's representation. That motion stays this proceeding as provided in Rule 240(b), SCACR.

This request is made in good faith, and not for the purpose of delay. This case fell in line with other cases now pending under counsel's responsibility. The Assistant Attorney General assigned to this case has been consulted and has no objection.

WHEREFORE, counsel requests that this first motion for an extension of time be granted and that filing will be due July 19, 2023. Counsel also requests that the time limits for filing the Rule 242(d) documents be held in abeyance pending a ruling on the pending motion.
