ORDER

On June 1, 2023, Appellant and Respondents filed a joint motion to file matters under seal. According to the motion, the trial court entered a consent order to file matters under seal on November 10, 2022, and both parties anticipated filing the same materials in a record on appeal. The parties requested this court enter an order allowing the parties leave to file the same materials under seal as part of a supplemental record on appeal for the same reasons approved by the trial court. The trial judge analyzed the factors identified in Rule 41.1(b), SCRCP, and allowed the parties to (1) submit a sealed version of their proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law and (2) seal any exhibits containing "Confidential" information as that term was defined in the consent confidentiality order entered on August 26, 2022.

After careful consideration of the joint motion and the trial court's order, the motion to file matters under seal is granted. The Appellant may file a supplemental record on appeal under seal, which contains the sealed versions of the parties proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law and any exhibits containing "Confidential" information as that term was defined in the consent confidentiality order entered on August 26, 2022.
