AS SUMMARY OF FACTUAL SUPPORT TO VACATE SENTENCE

(A) ANY person who has been convicted of or sentence for a crime and who claims the following (1) That the conviction or sentence WAS INVAID AND WAS in violation of the Constitution of the United States OR The Constitution OR LAWS of this State. The Records will show The prejudicial-presiding judge Goldsmith, Denied the Defendant to speak and Violated Defendant's 6 amendments Federal and state Constitutional Rights, Citing: stating a violation of Confrontation Clause by showing he was prohibited from engaging in otherwise appropriate cross-examination designed to show prototypical form of bias on the part of the witness, and thereby to expose the jury to the facts from which the jury could appropriately draw inference relating to reliability of the prosecution or witness. Citing U.S. Ct. Const. Amd 6 State v. STARN, 340 SC. 312, 531, S.E.2d. 907 (2000). Also State v. Page, 406 S.C. 272, 750 S.E. 2d. 623 (Ltr App 2013).

(2) The Court was without jurisdiction to impose sentence. (A) The Arrest WAS UNLAWFUL, without a warrant or probable cause to obtain an Arrest Warrant, which made to case unlawful to be tried, because the Officer Christian D Anderson Warrant and Police Report Shows clearly He lied to obtain it on Christmas Day of 2018. Because one can not put the car before the horse and ride. How one have jurisdiction to try a case if the case never existed or improperly indicted, without clarity of the Arrest Warrant Citing 17-13-50 Right to be informed of the grounds of ARREST, which WAS mentioned in the Trial Hearing, as to the officer's probable cause, as Police Report and warrant Shows suppose to have been the Victim Fredricka Washington's car keys, where as by the eye witness and the all state Evidence show clearly that witness says "mom you car keys are in the house those are Dad's keys not your. yet the officer lies the next day Tell the Judge his probable cause was find these keys in the Defendant's possession upon his arrival at the scene of the crime. which was the Reasons for the Judge Miss B.T. 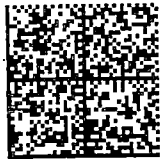
