

Dear Ms. Dukes:

We received your inquiry regarding the number of pages permitted in the appellant's brief. You are permitted to file a brief with the content set forth by Rule 208(b), SCACR, and your brief may not exceed 50 pages. You must also file a designation of matter, which is a specific list of the parts of the transcripts, pleadings, orders, exhibits, and other materials presented to the family court that are relevant to your appeal. See Rule 209, SCACR. In other words, the court reporter's transcript and attached exhibits are not included in the page count for your brief; however, if you wish for the Court to consider them along with the legal arguments in your brief, you must list these documents in your designation of matter.

In addition, because you included exhibits to the brief, we are returning those to you for inclusion in the record on appeal. You must list these documents in your designation of matter instead of filing them along with your brief. You must also provide a proof of service showing you have served a copy of your initial brief on counsel for the respondent. If you have not filed a designation of matter and a proof of service within ten (10) days of the date of this letter, your appeal will be dismissed.
