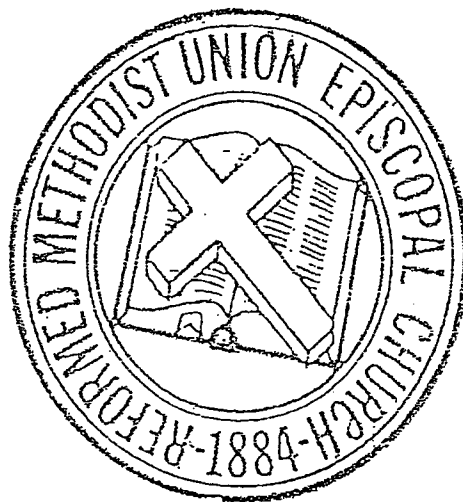

A motion was made by Rev. William Polite and seconded by Rev. Melvin Bolds that the seventh pew be the bound of the conference. The motion was carried.

A motion was made by Rev. William Polite and seconded by Rev. Powell Hampton to have Elder Ronald Wine and Rev. Robert Dunham serve as Marshalls. The motion carried.

A motion was made by Sis. Barbara B. Clark and seconded by Rev. Dan Green to have Sis. Deborah Coleman serve as recording secretary. The motion was carried.

Commissioning Service was held for General Officers by Bishop Gethers, assisted by Elder Fred H. Moore. During the service, Rev. Melvin Bolds intervened and wanted to know whether these General Officers were being installed because he wanted to run for an office. Bishop Gethers announced that the procedure is that you must make your declaration in the Annual Conference.

After a lengthy discussion it was decided that the floor was now open for nominees for any one seeking a General Office position. At this point Rev. Bolds made his declaration for Secretary of Church Extension. Sis. Katy Coaxum asked that the candidates give a statement indicating the reason why they are running for the position and what plans do they anticipate. Remarks were given by Sis. Barbara B. Clark and Rev. Melvin Bolds candidates seeking the office of Secretary of Church Extension.

Bro. Jenkins made a motion and it was seconded by Bro. Richardson that we use the two (2) Tellers elected in the Lay Delegates meeting. The motion was carried. The Tellers are: Sis. Emogene Backman and Sis. Elizabeth Taylor. The election was held by ballot voting and Rev. Melvin Bolds defeated Sis. Barbara B. Clark by a vote of 27 to 15. Bishop Gethers preceded in the Commissioning of General Officers for the years 2000-2004 with the newly elected Secretary of Church Extension being installed along with the other General Officers who were unopposed.

Sis. Ann Blandin asked the General Conference for permission to organize a Nurse's Unit in each District. A motion was made by Rev. William Watson and seconded by Rev. Wesley Moore that the Nurse's Unit be organized. The motion was carried.

Bishop Gethers asked for reports from General Officers for the years commencing 1992 – 1996.

GENERAL TREASURE'S REPORT

General Treasure's report was given by Rev. Dan Green. A motion was made by Rev. William Watson and seconded by Bishop Devoe. After the unreadiness by Elder Thomas Watson, The unreadiness was the amount in checking account. Rev. Green felt that amount was necessary to pay expenses. After a lengthy discussion a motion was made by Sis. Janet Williams and seconded by Sis. Emogene Backman that the General Treasurer look at other ways of investing the money to yield more interest. The motion was carried. The accounts and balances for the General Treasure are listed below:

Bishop Gethers announced that he remembered when the Denomination had nothing. We were able to lend out \$52,000 in one year. Thank God for the distance he has brought us.

Rev. William Watson announced that he is seeking the office of Associate Bishop because it is stated that we can have two (2) Associate Bishops. Elder Moore stated that according to the new Discipline the Associate Bishop office is not open.

The conference was adjourned for lunch break.

MONDAY, MAY 8, 2000 – 2:30 P.M.

Devotional Service was conducted by Rev. Dan Green and Rev. Powell Hampton. The opening selection was "Jesus Keeps Me Near the Cross" and invocation by Rev. Dan Green. The Scripture Reading Psalm 27 was read by Rev. Powell Hampton. The second hymn "Pass Me Not O Gentle Savior".

The conference was called to order by Bishop Gethers.

The roll was called by the General Secretary and minutes read by Recording Secretary. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Rev. William Watson and seconded by Rev. Powell Hampton. The motion was carried.

Bishop Gethers asked that we continue with the General Officer's Reports.

GENERAL SECRETARY REPORT

The General Secretary report given made by Bro. Willie B. Oliver. The total expenditures for the period May 1996 – May 2000 was \$221,454.26. A motion to accept the report was made by Rev. William Watson and seconded by Bishop Devoe. The motion was carried.

SECRETARY OF PENSION DEPARTMENT REPORT

The Pension Department Report was given by Rev. Joseph Powell. A motion was made by Rev. William Polite and seconded by Sis. Emogene Backman to have the report received. Elder Thomas Watson had an unreadiness. His unreadiness was why were two (2) names deleted from receiving pension. Elder Powell stated that the names of Rev. William Jefferson and Sis. Celia Cummings was deleted because they are not members of the Denomination. Bishop Jerry Devoe, stated that's correct because they are attending other churches in other denomination and they are no longer eligible to receive a pension from the R.M.U.E. Church. Sis. Janet Williams referred the conference to page 166 of the Discipline last sentence "The Preacher shall be a member of the quarterly conference" and that statement would make them ineligible to receive a pension. Some members felt that that if they left, it should have followed them. It was reported that they did not contribute anything to the fund. The Balance in this account is \$46,772.76.

SECRETARY OF EDUCATION REPORT

The Secretary of Education Department Report was given by Rev. William Polite. A motion to accept the report was made by Rev. Melvin Bolds and seconded by Rev. Powell Hampton. The motion was carried. The balance in this account is \$13, 866.32.

SECRETARY OF CHURCH EXTENSION REPORT

The Secretary of Church Extension Report was given by Sis. Barbara B. Clark. A motion to accept the report was made by Rev. William Watson and seconded by Rev. William Polite. The motion was carried. The balance in this account is \$20,206.32.

SECRETARY OF SUNDAY SCHOOL UNION REPORT

The Secretary of Sunday School Union report was given by Rev. Powell Hampton. A motion to accept the report was made by Rev. Joseph Powell and seconded by Rev. Warren Hatcher. The motion was carried. The balance in this account \$ 8,415.68.

SECRETARY OF MISSION REPORT

The Secretary of Mission Report was given by Rev. Warren Hatcher. A motion to accept the report was made by Bishop Devoe and seconded by Rev. Powell Hampton. The motion carried. The balance in this account \$ 7,897.60.

SECRETARY OF BOOK CONCERN REPORT

The Secretary of Book Concern Report was given by Sis. Ann Blandin. A motion to accept the report was made by Sis. Viola Chisolm and seconded by Rev. William Watson. The motion carried. Sis. Blandin reported \$2,340 to the General Treasurer for Disciplines. The balance in this account \$2,120.

The Committee on Presiding Elder's Salary gave their report. This committee recommended an increase of \$1.00 per member. The new rate yearly will be \$9.60 per member. A motion to adopt was made by Bro. David Pender and seconded by Rev. Melvin Bolds. The motion was carried.

Committee on Pastor's Salary gave their report. This committee recommended an increase for all Pastor's. The new rate ranges from 20% to 25%. The new monthly salaries are:

A motion to adopt this report was made by Rev. Joseph Powell and seconded by Rev. Powell Hampton. Elder Thomas Watson stated that he had an unreadiness. His question was why pay increases are 20% to 25% and not an equal amount across the board. Bro. Ceasar Jenkins felt that they should not receive a 20% to 25% increase when most people who receive social security only receive a 3% increase from the government. After a lengthy discussion many of the members gave their comments: Elder Fred Moore stated, we were born out of paying cheap wages and we must be persuaded to pay our tithes. Sis. Ann Blandin stated that, she doesn't mind paying but we are paying for what we get, we must have ministers that are better equip. Sis. Barbara Clark stated, the only way we will be able to attract more and better-equipped ministers, we must have a decent salary in place. Bro. Samuel Smalls stated that what ever increase is decided here he will be happy to give it to his pastor because of the good work he is doing.

He also talked about how he has begun to pay his tithes and what a difference it has made in his life. Sis. Chisolm stated that all ministers should get a raise of equal value. It was decided that this issue is voted on. It was passed by a vote of 28 to 13 all Pastors will receive their new increases effective immediately.

Committee on Missionary, Auxiliary, Senior and Junior Conference Workers Boards gave their report. This committee recommended an increase of .25 per member. The new rate will be .50 per member at each local convention. A motion to adopt was made by Rev. Powell Hampton and seconded by Rev. Wesley Moore. The motion was carried.

Committee on Church Assessment and General Conference gave their report. This committee recommended that no increase be made at this time. The motion to adopt was made by Rev. Warren Hatcher and seconded by Bro. George Richardson. The motion was carried.

Committee on Richardson Day, Fifth Sunday, and Easter Day gave their report and offered the following recommendations:

- Widows be increased from \$1.50 to \$2.50 per member
- Richardson Day be increased from \$1.25 to \$1.75 per member
- Fifth Sunday remains the same \$1.50 per member

A motion to adopt was made by Bro. George Richardson and seconded by Bro. Ceasar Jenkins. The motion was carried.

Committee on Church Extension and Easter Day gave their report. This committee recommended that no changes be made at this time. A motion to adopt was made by Bro. Jimmie L. Woods and seconded by Sis. Viola Chisolm. The motion was carried.

Committee on Education and Children's Day gave their report. This committee offered the following recommendations:

- Increase Education from \$3.00 to \$4.00 per member annual
- Increase Children's Day from \$1.25 to \$1.50 per member annual

A motion to adopt was made by Bro. Caesar Jenkins and seconded by Rev. Wesley Moore. Rev. Polite stated that he had an unreadiness and he was not concerned about the increase but felt like he was being badgered. He is always concern and willing to do whatever with the Education Department. A committee was formed to assist with additional funds but the group met a few times and had a few programs but that was it.

Bishop Gethers asked for a raise for the Youth Congress. A motion was made by Sis. Emogene Backman and seconded by Rev. Warren Hatcher to increase the amount given to Youth Congress from \$700 to \$900 per year. The motion was carried.

Elder Ronald Wine wanted to know when will all of these increases become effective? All increases and changes made are effective on the date changes were made.

Rev. Powell Hampton, Secretary of Sunday School Union stated that he welcomed recommendations and suggestions from the members on ways he can improve this department.

The Delegates were disbursed \$30.00 for food.

Since there was no further business, the General Conference was adjourned until Tuesday, May 9, 2000 at 10:00 a.m.

TUESDAY, MAY 9, 2000 – 10:00 a.m.

Devotional service was conducted by Elder Ronald Wine and Rev. Rev. Robert L. Dunham. The opening selection was "I'm Going to Hide Behind the Mountain". The invocation was given by Elder Ronald Wine. The Scripture Reading Revelation 22: 1-18 read by Rev. Dunham.

Bishop Gethers gave thanks to be present in the house of worship on the second day of our General Conference. He stated that God has been good to us and hope that we can meet together in love, peace and unity for the good of our church. If we love the church we should give it our time, talent and money. The Lord loves a cheerful giver. We should pay our tithes and offering to our church. Let us listen to God's word and be governed by God's word, because we can't beat God's giving, the more we give, and the more he gives to you.

The conference was called to order by Bishop Gethers. The roll was called by the General Secretary and minutes read by the recording secretary. A motion to accept the minutes with the necessary correction was made by Rev. Powell Hampton and seconded by Rev. Warren Hatcher. The motion was carried. The correction is the checking account balance in Sunday School Union Department is \$8,415.68.

Sis. Blandin stated that we have agreed not to lend any more money until we receive some of the money back that was loaned out. She feels we need to have a procedure in place and charge an interest fee of at least 1%. Bishop Gethers commented that he has pastored many churches and they have never come to the Denomination to borrow money. They have always gone to the bank to apply for their loan.

After a lengthy discussion the body was asked to vote on the percentage for any church requesting a loan. The results are:

3% - 17
5% - 1
1% - 14

The loans will be at a 3% interest.

A motion was made by Rev. Warren Hatcher and seconded by Sis. Deborrah Coleman that an amendment to the Discipline state that any one wishing to run for general office must make their declaration in the annual conference preceding the general conference and it will be included on the annual conference program. This amendment was approved by a vote of 27. The motion was carried.

It was also decided that if a vacancy is created by (death, incapacitation, expulsion, etc.) the Presiding Bishop has the authority to appoint a person to fill the position until General Conference, after that, someone can make their declaration to run for that office.

Bro. Caesar Jenkins read the proposals from the lay delegates.

Item # 6 - A motion to adopt was made by Bro. Richardson and seconded by Rev. Powell Hampton that the Ministers with a small church receive a \$300.00 per quarter instead of \$150.00 per quarter. The motion was carried

Elder Ronald Wine asked what happens after a presiding Bishop has served his four years? Bro. Caesar Jenkins stated that after demise of the present presiding Bishop any one who is qualified and seeks that office will be elected to a term of four years. After the (4) four years expires, that position is open for election. If that person is defeated, he will be sent to pastor a church. There will only be one presiding Bishop.

Sis. Coleman felt that we should have procedures in place for those ministers receiving assistance from the Denomination. She further stated that it's the church along with the Stewards to see that a pastor is receiving his salary. All churches have Pastor's Anniversary etc. wherein the pastor's receive monies from the church. If the members were to pay their tithes and offering, it would not be a problem. At some point, those pastor's receiving assistance can eventually be weaned out if there membership changes. Rev. Robert Dunham felt that we are our brother's keeper and we should help. It is our responsibility to help the smaller church. It would not be right if the Denomination does not assist these churches. We should help as long as we are able to do so.

Rev. Powell Hampton asked if the Youth Congress can be changed from the 3rd Saturday in July to the 1st Saturday in September. After a lengthy discussion a substitute motion was made by Rev. William Watson and seconded by Sis. Janet Williams that the Youth Congress be held on the 3rd Saturday in September effective this year. The motion was carried.

Sis. Theresa Golden read the Proposal from Savannah District. Sis. Elizabeth Taylor stated that she is on the Savannah District and was not aware of this Proposal. Sis Golden asked that the proposal be submitted from Mt. Olive R.M.U.E. Church. A motion to adopt was made by Bro. Willie B. Oliver and seconded by Elder Thomas Watson that Mt. Olive Church proposal be adopted. Elder Fred H. Moore asked that an amendment to the proposal to a 3.00 GPA instead of 4.00. After a lengthy discussion was held some members commented as to: 1.) will every district be able to receive a scholarship and how will they be selected.



The meeting was called to order by the Pastor. The roll was called followed by the reading of the minutes from the April meeting. The minutes were accepted as information. \$9 collected in dues.

COMMUNION REPORT

Br. Bright, Sis. Roper, Sis. Thomasina Walker, Sis. Murray, Sis. Washington, Br. Richard Brown, and Elder Richardson gave reports on those members they communed.

OLD BUSINESS

Evaluation Committee-the board discussed developing an evaluation tool for the Musician Position. The pastor then appointed Sis. Roper, Br. Richard Brown, Elder Green, Sis. Washington, and Sis. Matthews to develop the evaluation tool and identify a time frame for the evaluation.

Choir Visitations-it was questioned if the choir could rehearse songs for visitations. It was noted that this request was presented to the choir with no action. The pastor suggested to address in choir meeting and/or rehearsal. It was noted that the choir was not having meetings to discuss. The pastor agreed to address this issue with the President and the Musician.

NEW BUSINESS

Funeral Planning for Members-the board was informed by Br. Herbert Brown that a check was received from the funeral home for grave plot fee for a member, which may have been an oversight on the part of the funeral home. He suggested the church secretary accompany the Pastor and Pastor Steward when making arrangements with the family. Elder Richardson then explained the process used when preparing the funeral services, along with privileges.

After some discussion, the pastor suggested to propose a policy re: a member of the church selecting another pastor, beside himself to conduct the funeral services. Br. Moore questioned the pastor if the Associate Bishop contacted him re: performing services. Answer, no. Br. Bolds informed the board funeral arrangements along with the program had been completed and given to the funeral home by the time he and the pastor arrived at the home.

9. The pending litigation will be dismissed with prejudice after entry of a final consent order; and
10. Formal settlement documents, including a mutual general release, to be executed by the parties in the form of a consent order. 



18 better man for the job as it -- under the
19 circumstances.

20 THE COURT: Who is the minister present
21 at Payne Church?

22 MR. JOHNSON: Reverend Junious.

23 THE COURT: All right. I got the names
24 straight. Be glad to hear you, Mr. Curry. It's
25 your motion.

1 MR. CURRY: Thank you very much, Your
2 Honor. If it please the Court, I am Eduardo Curry.
3 Judge, I think you have got it pretty straight.
4 You pretried --

5 THE COURT: Let me interrupt you. Do
6 you have a caption?

7 THE COURT REPORTER: I don't.

8 THE COURT: Let me give her a caption
9 real quick. Let me put on the record before we get
10 started that I heard this case nonjury, I don't
11 remember when, was it last winter?

12 MR. JOHNSON: Yes, sir.

13 THE COURT: It's been close to about
14 ten months.

15 MR. CURRY: Yes, sir.

16 THE COURT: And I took it under
17 advisement. I met with the attorneys and
18 encouraged the attorneys to get the parties to
19 mediate the case to see if they could resolve it.
20 They did mediate it. I was informed that they had
21 entered an agreement or an agreement had been
22 reached at mediation and I was later informed that
23 there was a hang-up with that agreement.

24 And I asked Mr. Curry to file a motion
25 so I could hear it in open court with the court

1 record. That's why we are here this morning on Mr.
2 Curry's motion. I will be glad to hear you.

3 MR. CURRY: Thank very much, Your
4 Honor. You have summed it up. We had a mediation
5 with Dawes Cooke which occurred August 31st, 2015,
6 and we actually mediated this case for 12 hours.
7 Judge, just to sort of make the record complete if
8 I may, may I approach?

9 THE COURT: Yes, sir.

10 MR. CURRY: Attorney Johnson has this.
11 What we have -- what I have handed and I will get
12 marked, Your Honor, was a letter from the mediator
13 basically saying that if we are going to have
14 mediation you have got to present people who have
15 authority to make the decision. If you look at
16 that, I would like to have that marked.

17 THE COURT: The rules say that.

18 MR. CURRY: Yes, Your Honor. I would
19 like to have this marked as --

20 THE COURT: Mark it as I guess you are
21 the Plaintiff.

22 MR. CURRY: Plaintiff. Marked as
23 number 1. And I have got -- I would like to have
24 marked as number 2, which is the ADR notice to the
25 judge that we had the mediation and it was

1 12 hours. I want to put that in the record.

2 THE COURT: Okay.

3 (PLF. EXH. 1, letter, was marked for
4 identification.)

5 (PLF. EXH. 2, ADR notice, was marked
6 for identification.)

7 MR. CURRY: Judge, I would ask that we
8 move these in the record. Exhibit No. 1, move it
9 for identification and actually it's Plaintiff's
10 Exhibit and Exhibit No. 2 for identification as
11 Plaintiff's Exhibit.

12 MR. JOHNSON: No objection.

13 (PLF. EXHS 1-2 in evidence.)

14 THE COURT: Thank you very much.

15 MR. CURRY: Judge, and at that time we
16 actually came up with an agreement, settlement
17 agreement with Dawes Cooke which was signed by the
18 people who said that they had the authority to make
19 the decision. And the caveat on 10 was well,
20 Bishop Polite wanted to look at it to see whether
21 or not it violated any of his conscience;
22 eventually he said that it did. But, Judge, we put
23 in an heroic effort as the Plaintiffs and the
24 Defendants to try to bring a mass of people
25 together obviously with the goal of this church not

1 splintering. The financial issues of the church
2 were paramount. We had real property and personal
3 property and money and additional money that came
4 in from a condemnation.

5 And it is felt that in the mediation
6 the spirit of it is that the church was in this
7 James Island community in order to reach people,
8 homeless, the lost, the marginal, the unsaved and
9 not spend all their money paying lawyers and
10 spending time in litigation.

11 And so after 12 hours we -- like any
12 mediation, not everybody is happy, but we thought
13 there was a doable deal that should work. And so
14 what I did was I filed a motion to enforce the
15 agreement that we came up with on August 31st of
16 2015.

17 Judge, we believe that there was a
18 meeting of the minds. We believe that the people
19 who had the authority held themselves out. It was
20 general officers who do not work for the bishop
21 because the general officers actually run the
22 church. The bishop is just the figurehead, but at
23 the end of the day the people who had the
24 authority, the general officers and the folks were
25 there, members of Payne Church Corporation, members

1 of Payne RMUE that was there present. And it was a
2 long, detailed process and we believe that it
3 should not go for naught, that we should enforce
4 this agreement and put this church back together
5 and see if we can move it forward. And that's why
6 I filed the motion, Your Honor.

7 THE COURT: Well, on paragraph 10,
8 what's your interpretation?

9 MR. CURRY: Judge, my interpretation
10 was really that there was a settlement. They
11 indicated to me that more than likely it was --
12 there was a settlement. We put it in there because
13 we didn't want there to be a total rift about maybe
14 an ecclesiastical matter. So you have to read 10
15 in conjunction with 1. And 1 was the appeasement
16 that an RMUE person would be there, that Reverend
17 Junious who had been certified under the RMUE
18 system, had a license, but would be able to come
19 back if we believed there was any kind of --

20 THE COURT: He had a license from RMUE
21 that was withdrawn.

22 MR. JOHNSON: That is correct.

23 THE COURT: Was he the preacher at the
24 time of the withdrawal?

25 MR. CURRY: Yes, he was. And so what

1 we believe is coming back and remaining the
2 preacher that he would go with Bishop Polite. We
3 didn't think there were any impediments that would
4 cause him not to be in good and regular standing,
5 nothing had changed, he had not been arrested.
6 They were going to pay the dues that were due from
7 the RMUE, they reduced the conference claim because
8 that wasn't the original amount of the conference
9 claim, but in an effort to sort of make this matter
10 work, they reduced it to a minimum on the
11 conference claim, the delegates, they let them have
12 the same amount of delegates that were there, and
13 so that what we are trying to do is place it in a
14 status quo prior to the schism. And then if
15 Reverend Junious and Reverend Richardson who was
16 there, they moved forward, that there may be an
17 opportunity for Reverend Junious if he didn't get
18 reappointed there to get a new appointment
19 somewhere else, but that was going to be between he
20 and the bishop during the annual conference. As,
21 you know, the annual conference, is it the time
22 that the bishop signs the license for and the
23 appointment for all the membership to go to their
24 various churches.

25 THE COURT: The bishop works for the

1 RMUE board.

2 MR. CURRY: That's correct, works for
3 the board. And so the board is one -- the general
4 board was the one that was there at the mediation.

5 THE COURT: Why -- do you know why
6 Bishop Polite would not agree to Junious to
7 continue on at the church?

8 MR. CURRY: I'm going to let Attorney
9 Johnson speak, but I do want to say one thing about
10 this. That the general board indicated that they
11 had asked Bishop Polite not to come because they
12 were going to just handle it based on the fact that
13 they were kind of the people who were running it.
14 He would have been at that mediation there.

15 And so based on that, the
16 representation of the general secretary and the
17 potential members were hey, we can get this
18 resolved and that's why he wasn't there and they
19 put this caveat in there maybe out of deference is
20 my position because originally he was the actual
21 associate bishop and then when Fred Henderson
22 Moore, and you know about going to the Supreme
23 Court and all that coming back, and so he wasn't
24 there. He kind of assumed the position by
25 appointment and not by election because Fred

1 Henderson Moore was removed and never reinstated
2 himself even though the court, Supreme Court,
3 reverted their action back down to the lower court
4 for some kind of disposition, but he never did
5 anything about it.

6 THE COURT: Under the -- I know you're
7 probably familiar with this, I will hear from Mr.
8 Johnson if he has a contrary opinion, under the
9 church hierarchy, the ruling board of the RMUE
10 organization, who has the authority within the
11 church hierarchy to make contracts and perform
12 legal documents and make legal decisions as far as
13 RMUE organization? I apologize, organization may
14 be the wrong term, I apologize if it is.

15 MR. CURRY: Well, Judge, I believe that
16 because there is a hierarchy of the church and you
17 got the general board, the bishop is the figurehead
18 and obviously always signed, but he wouldn't sign
19 on his own without the approval of his general
20 board because he would be out there on a limb by
21 himself. So it's the general board that normally
22 makes the decision because each one of them have a
23 title, secretary, treasurer.

24 THE COURT: Does the general board make
25 policy?

1 MR. CURRY: I believe so.

2 THE COURT: And the bishop runs it on a
3 day-to-day basis or how does the organization work?

4 MR. CURRY: Judge, it's my
5 understanding that the bishop doesn't run the
6 day-to-day operations of the church. I believe
7 that's the secretary and general board that deals
8 with all of that. The bishop is a figurehead. So
9 when you got Union, Reformed Union, Methodist,
10 Episcopal church. So the bishop is the recognized
11 leader, but in terms of handling the business, it's
12 going to be the general board.

13 They were the ones that were there at
14 the mediation. The bishop may make appointments,
15 but he's not going to make them because what you
16 have here is you got a bishop, then you got the
17 people who manage it like the presiding elders of
18 each of these districts who recommend pastors.

19 So a lot of times the bishop doesn't
20 know these pastors, doesn't know their work,
21 because they meet with their presiding elders and
22 they come up to an annual conference and then every
23 four years they have like a general conference.
24 And then we have the general conference. That's
25 when everybody comes together, they make rules,

1 they make doctrines and discipline, you know, they
2 do all the stuff at the general conference. And
3 they also will elect bishops, and, you know,
4 appoint people to a particular job. That's the
5 business part of most Methodist churches in terms
6 of the hierarchy. Bishop is a just figurehead.
7 But inside or the workings come up through the
8 general board through the general --

9 THE COURT: The bishop does have the
10 authority to assign pastors in a Methodist church?

11 MR. CURRY: That is correct. Had that
12 authority through the annual conference.

13 THE COURT: Do they rotate these
14 pastors on a routine basis or it's just up to the
15 bishop?

16 MR. CURRY: They do rotate them, Judge.
17 They are traveling pastors. So once assigned a
18 church it's no guarantee you are going to be there
19 for life. Sometimes people stay as long as they
20 are -- I would say from my personal experience
21 being a Methodist preacher and pastor, I was at a
22 church eight and-a-half years and just recently
23 they transferred me to a church in McClellanville.
24 So Methodism is Methodism whether you are RMUE or
25 whether you are African Methodist Episcopal. When

1 you talk about the hierarchy, it's going to be the
2 same. In fact, RMUE was a member of AME at one
3 particular time.

4 THE COURT: Who did you have at Payne
5 Church, I say Payne RMUE Church, that had the
6 authority to approve the settlement?

7 MR. CURRY: General secretary. General
8 secretary, there was a person of general annuity,
9 there was a person there for admissions; they had
10 most of their general members of the board there.

11 THE COURT: All right. I'm talking
12 about you. For you, because I see you signed on
13 behalf of your client, Mr. Johnson signed on behalf
14 of his. I am asking who authorized you to sign it.

15 MR. CURRY: I had the pastor, I had the
16 stewards, I had the trustees. As you know in
17 Methodist, the stewards handle the financial, the
18 membership and the spiritual part of the church.
19 The trustees handle the physical part of the
20 church, okay? So they signed. Once he broke us up
21 I had pastor, stewards, trustees, and there is
22 members of heads and boards that were there.
23 Approximately maybe 20, 25 people. Wasn't just --
24 it wasn't just Attorney Johnson and Attorney Cook
25 and myself doing it. We had a whole gamut of

1 people.

2 THE COURT: Thank you. Mr. Johnson.

3 MR. JOHNSON: Your Honor, it's
4 irrelevant to put on the record I disagree with the
5 characterization of the Fred Henderson Moore
6 litigation.

7 THE COURT: Well, I don't -- I know the
8 Supreme Court ruled and other than that that
9 doesn't affect my decision in this case.

10 MR. JOHNSON: To answer your last
11 question first --

12 THE COURT: Because I am going to ask
13 you the same question.

14 MR. JOHNSON: Yes, sir. I figured you
15 were. There were a host of people. I don't know,
16 maybe a hundred or probably about equal amounts
17 from both churches. They included the local Payne
18 RMUE clergy and membership and deacons and elders
19 and church officers. There were a number of RMUE
20 denomination general officers. There was more than
21 enough people there with authority to speak for
22 both sides. The bishop was there -- was not there,
23 and that may have been my doing because when we
24 started, seemed like we started late because of a
25 flood and we finished late. In fact, I'm not sure

1 there is not a little poetic license in 831. I
2 think it might have already been into the next day
3 when we actually put the ink to the paper.

4 Because I know I didn't leave there
5 until after midnight. As a consequence we didn't
6 get everybody to sign because a lot of these people
7 were elderly and some of them had to leave for
8 health reasons because they were starving and
9 various other things. So we didn't get everybody
10 there to sign. I think we do have a list or the
11 mediator has a list of -- a notebook pad showing
12 who all was there.

13 THE COURT: You all made it part of the
14 record.

15 MR. CURRY: We did not, Judge, but we
16 can get it to make it part of the record.

17 THE COURT: Good. I would like it as
18 part of the record.

19 MR. JOHNSON: We did not contend that
20 -- we are not challenging anybody's -- I would
21 represent to the Court that I didn't sign on behalf
22 of the Plaintiff without authorization of the
23 proper people on the Plaintiff. There was a
24 condition that the bishop had to approve the
25 agreement as to Junious and so we are down to as we

1 | view it one man standing in the way of saving this
2 | church and that's Mr. Junious.

3 | THE COURT: Do you know why he won't
4 | approve Junious?

5 | MR. JOHNSON: Yes, sir.

6 | THE COURT: It was just to November of
7 | 2016 and he could be reappointed at that time the
8 | way I read the agreement; is that correct?

9 | MR. JOHNSON: Yes, sir. Or not.

10 | THE COURT: Or not. He could be
11 | reappointed or not reappointed.

12 | MR. JOHNSON: And I would also
13 | represent to the Court that there are e-mails and I
14 | would -- should I lose this motion I would like
15 | this to be in the record. There are e-mails where
16 | it stipulated that Reverend Junious if he were to
17 | serve would be committed to operate under the RMUE
18 | discipline and doctrine and comport himself as an
19 | RMUE minister should. And if he did not he would
20 | be subject to all the same, no greater, no less.

21 | THE COURT: I think number 1 says Payne
22 | Church will re-align as RMUE. I think they
23 | incorporate all of the ecclesiastical rules and
24 | regulations.

25 | MR. JOHNSON: Yes, sir. We'd just like

1 it noted --

2 THE COURT: I will let you mark
3 whatever you want to mark. If you want to mark all
4 the e-mails, that's fine, I will be happy for you
5 to mark them.

6 MR. JOHNSON: I would just like it
7 noted that this would not be like -- should you
8 grant the motion, that Mr. Junious would not be
9 tenured so to speak and above -- not above all the
10 rules just because he got a court order allowing
11 him to stay and he would stay subject to --

12 THE COURT: I think he has got to
13 follow the ecclesiastical rules of the
14 organization.

15 MR. JOHNSON: I just wanted that --

16 THE COURT: I think Mr. Curry would
17 agree with that?

18 MR. CURRY: Yes, Your Honor, I do. If
19 he is going to be RMUE he has to abide by RMUE
20 rules.

21 MR. JOHNSON: I just felt compelled to
22 make sure that was clear on the record.

23 THE COURT: I understand.

24 MR. JOHNSON: Your Honor, just in
25 simplistic -- personally frankly I regret that it

1 didn't go through. Like I said, we worked until
2 midnight or later and got a grudging agreement on
3 both sides. Both sides left unhappy which
4 typically means --

5 THE COURT: That probably makes a good
6 agreement. If both sides are a little bit unhappy
7 that probably makes a good agreement.

8 MR. JOHNSON: Both sides are a little
9 bit unhappy with their lawyers perhaps, but both
10 sides ultimately agreed subject to the approval of
11 the judge -- of the bishop. And I sort of
12 analogize that to some of the things that are
13 subject to approval by the governor or subject to I
14 guess if Mr. Curry and I agree that you would -- we
15 would try a case before Judge Nichols in July at
16 a certain place, then that would still be subject
17 to approval by Justice Toals, but simplistically
18 there was a condition precedent that didn't occur.
19 And it's our -- that is the long and short of our
20 position. Again, should you rule against us, I
21 would --

22 THE COURT: Does the board or the
23 board, the RMUE board, the secretary, the president
24 and whatever the organization consists of, do they
25 now want to back away from this agreement because

1 of Bishop Polite's position concerning Pastor
2 Junious?

3 MR. JOHNSON: They do not want to --
4 they don't want to defy the bishop, nor abandon the
5 hundred year-old discipline. They are less excited
6 about the settlement now than they were before
7 because of some comments and whatnot, but that's
8 not before the Court and that's not in evidence.

9 THE COURT: Let me ask you this: I
10 read 10 and I think I understand what it says, that
11 Bishop Polite has to approve Reverend Junious's
12 tenure.

13 Now, you may not be able to answer, but
14 I'm going to ask you anyway. There's no -- in this
15 paragraph there's no -- I am looking for the right
16 word, there's no reasons why he should turn down or
17 not turn down. But my question to you is this:
18 Does he have any church policy rules as to why he's
19 not qualified? Or is this just a personal thing,
20 goes back to withdrawal of the Payne Church from
21 RMUE that caused this whole controversy?

22 MR. JOHNSON: I do not think that
23 Reverend Junious is disqualified by felony or
24 conduct or any other objective church rule. I
25 think it's solely his view. I don't mean to be

1 flippant, but he's installing a fox to watch the
2 henhouse or appointing a person who has previously
3 been treasonous, that kind of thing. But there is
4 no objective.

5 THE COURT: Does he violate any of the
6 ecclesiastical rules and regulations of the RMUE
7 organization, I guess that's the proper question.

8 MR. JOHNSON: There is nothing other
9 than a subjective judgment.

10 THE COURT: That's what I was asking,
11 is this objective or subjective?

12 MR. JOHNSON: Yes, sir.

13 THE COURT: I mean right or wrong, you
14 may be right, it's subjective, I don't know.
15 Anything else?

16 MR. JOHNSON: No, sir. Like I say, our
17 position is simple contract argument, there's
18 condition precedent that was not met.

19 THE COURT: Mr. Curry.

20 MR. CURRY: Judge, we stand by our
21 arguments. I will bring --

22 THE COURT: Talk to me about the
23 condition precedent.

24 MR. CURRY: Your Honor, I don't think
25 that it was a condition precedent. And the reason

1 being is that I think it was more like conditional
2 because if they didn't have the authority then the
3 mediation should be null and void from the
4 beginning and I think that their representation was
5 that they had the authority to settle this case and
6 they made that their authority by authorizing their
7 attorney to sign it. So number one, you don't show
8 up to a mediation without people who don't have
9 authority. Number two, once you negotiated --
10 negotiated you don't have your lawyer to sign on
11 your behalf, and he has indicated that he didn't
12 sign against their wishes unless they thought they
13 had an agreement. So then if you come and say
14 condition precedent that deals with this has to be
15 approved before we can have authority would be
16 illusory because you presented yourself twice to
17 have authority.

18 So what we are asking is that you
19 enforce it so that we can put this church back
20 together and see if we can make it work. Now yes,
21 it is temporary. We don't know what's going to
22 happen come annual conference in 2016, but that's
23 not your worry. Your worry is whether or not
24 legally when we went to mediation did they have the
25 authority to go to mediation and did they do it

1 properly. And our position is yes, there were
2 witnesses, we had the necessary people there on
3 both sides, Payne Corporation, Payne RMUE. The
4 only person that was there -- that wasn't there was
5 Bishop Polite, but it was at their insistence that
6 he not be there and then they said well, it is
7 conditioned -- all these things are conditioned on
8 this. And when I look at the settlement agreement,
9 it even talks about that paragraph 2 may also be
10 modified by agreement between Junious and Polite
11 and something that they can deal with
12 ecclesiastically. It doesn't stop from having this
13 agreement being enforced in its totality and then
14 let the pastor and the bishop talk about what's
15 going to go on and how it is going to go on.
16 Reverend Junious has to be -- has to operate this
17 church as an RMUE based on this agreement. All
18 right? Reverend Richardson will be there, he will
19 be compensated as kind of a copastor and it says in
20 paragraph 1 with regard to it, okay? And Reverend
21 Junious will serve as pastor, Reverend Richardson
22 will serve as associate pastor until the 2016
23 conference.

24 And now they are saying we don't want
25 to have this, we are going to open this case back

1 to -- remember, there is two parts. You tried one
2 part about the property and the other part about
3 who owns it. And I think that problematically I
4 would say this just reading the deeds and all this
5 I'm still not convinced, Judge, it may not have
6 anything to do with this, that RMUE as a
7 denomination owns that property. Because it's
8 deeded into trustees of the Payne Chapel RMUE, not
9 the general church.

10 And so, Judge, the only thing I'm
11 saying is if we want to put it together and try to
12 make it work, this agreement has to be enforced.
13 They said they had the authority, they signed
14 saying they had authority, they had the lawyers
15 sign they had the authority, and now it's the day
16 of reckoning and they say well, Bishop Polite, he
17 had some condition precedent and I just don't think
18 that there's a condition precedent in there.

19 THE COURT: All right. Thank you so
20 very much.

21 MR. CURRY: You're welcome. Your
22 Honor, may I approach the court reporter and give
23 the exhibits back?

24 THE COURT: That would be fine. Mr.
25 Johnson, anything you want to say?

1 MR. JOHNSON: No, sir.

2 THE COURT: Thank you so very much.

3 First of all, let me say this: I have not ruled on
4 the underlying question of who owns the property
5 and the cemetery next to the Payne RMUE church here
6 at James Island here in Charleston County. And
7 that was what was basically litigated before this
8 Court.

9 As I said earlier, I had asked the
10 parties to see if they could resolve it. This
11 Court's major concern was I understand from the
12 testimony the people that remain with RMUE were
13 very small in number, they had gone to another
14 church at James Island. There was not enough of
15 those people to sustain the operating of Payne
16 Church.

17 And, Mr. Curry, contrary to your
18 argument, and that's the same argument you made at
19 trial, the Court does not accept that argument. I
20 don't think there's any question that an RMUE
21 church organization owns the church, owns the
22 cemetery. And I'm going to put that in the form of
23 an order so there is no more dispute about it.

24 The deed where it transfers from RMUE
25 to Payne Church I think should be a nullity and

1 void. That would have been my ruling. However, I
2 did not rule because I was concerned, I wanted the
3 church to survive. That's been there since the
4 early 1800's.

5 MR. CURRY: Yes, Your Honor.

6 THE COURT: I wanted the church to
7 survive. And that was a major concern, but I can't
8 get into the ecclesiastical aspect of it. The only
9 thing I can rule on is the issue of who owns it and
10 I was going to rule RMUE owned it. Therefore, I
11 was afraid it's going to put you in a financial
12 situation of losing the church. Therefore, I asked
13 you all to mediate it. You all mediated it and you
14 all were successful.

15 Now, as to paragraph 10, my
16 interpretation of paragraph 10 is that, yes, Bishop
17 Polite had the authority to state that Reverend
18 Junious could not be the pastor at the Payne
19 Church; however, I interpret that to mean that he
20 just could not arbitrarily refuse to allow that to
21 happen for subjective reasons. He had to base it
22 upon some rule or regulation, violation within the
23 rules before he would approve it. And I think that
24 goes to the contract here of fair dealings between
25 the parties. And I think every contract has an

1 implied good faith in fair dealings. As you sit
2 back and let this contract -- let the parties
3 hammer it out, it would be nullified simply because
4 Bishop Polite just arbitrarily said I'm not going
5 to let Junious be pastor of that church unless he
6 has a valid reason under the rules and guidelines.
7 I have been informed it's strictly subjective
8 because he's the one that led the departure from
9 RMUE originally.

10 Based upon that I think that is a
11 proper interpretation of 10. Yes, he had the right
12 to approve or disapprove it; however, he had to do
13 that with some objectivity as to the rules and
14 regulations, whether the man wasn't qualified or
15 was qualified.

16 Now, having said that, I'm going to
17 enforce this settlement that was signed by the
18 parties and reduced to writing and that qualifies
19 under the rules. I'm going to enforce the
20 settlement, plus I'm going to issue my order as to
21 ownership of the property. Who will send me a
22 proposed order?

23 MR. JOHNSON: I will try my hand at it
24 and send it to Mr. Curry and I'm sure you'll have
25 some modifications or some suggestions and then

1 hopefully --

2 MR. CURRY: We will work on it.

3 THE COURT: How much time? Christmas
4 is coming up.

5 MR. CURRY: At least 30 days.
6 Christmas is coming up. Could we have it by
7 January 30th?

8 THE COURT: That's fine. Get a
9 proposed order by January 30th. I want to cover
10 this ownership issue, I want to put that to rest.
