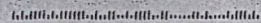
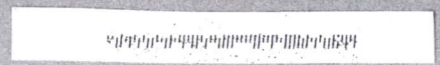

Dear Clerk of Court;


I received your letter dated August 7, 2023. To which I received after August 10, 2023, noting this Court is extending the Appellant 20 days to include reason this action should proceed and not be barred by the law of successiveness, or under the statute of limitations.

Appellant takes this time to explain. During the time for which to preserve an Applicant's PCR claims for review on writ of certiorari, to the State's Supreme Court. Counsel at PCR stage was asked to perfect a 59(e), under the South Carolina Rules of Civil Procedure. There was some discrepancies and omitted findings of fact and conclusions of law, which fell inconsistent with §17-27-80, S.C. Code Ann.

Well, in order to remedy this failure to file the requested 59(e). Applicant filed this pro-se brief addressing these facts. Praying the Court will vacate the PCR Judge's final order.
