## ORDER

Appellant filed a motion dated September 8, 2023, seeking an order of the Court directing the Commission on Indigent Defense to assume the costs of printing, binding, filing, and serving her record on appeal and final briefs. This remedy was requested on December 28, 2022, and the request was denied on January 13, 2023. Appellant filed a second motion on March 3, 2023, seeking the same relief, and the motion was dismissed with prejudice on March 8, 2023.

The Supreme Court issued an order restricting Appellant's ability to file in the courts of this state. The Supreme Court directed Clerks of Court to deliver all filings made by Appellant to the Chief Judge to determine whether the filing complies with the restrictions. *See In the Matter of Marie Assa'ad-Faltas*, S.C. Sup. Ct. Order dated June 10, 2022. Appellant's September 8, 2023 motion seeking assistance in printing and binding the record on appeal and final briefs is dismissed with prejudice.

Appellant's motion for leave to argue against precedent is denied. For good cause shown, Appellant's request for an extension to serve and file the record on appeal is granted and extended until October 11, 2023. No further extensions will be granted.
