

ORDER

Respondent has filed a motion requesting this court grant him an additional extension of fifteen days to file his return to Petitioner's motion to suppress evidence. Respondent asserts the grounds for his motion is that one of his counsel of record is traveling abroad on the day his return is due. Respondent's motion for a second extension is denied and his return is due five days from the date of this order. *See* S.C. Code Ann. § 17-30-110(A) (2014) (explaining a motion to suppress intercepted communications "must be made before the reviewing authority and must be decided on an expedited basis"); *Re: Pilot Program for the Designation of Secure Leave Periods by Lawyers*, No. 2011-11-16-01 (S.C. Sup. Ct. filed Nov. 16, 2022) (explaining "[a]ny lawyer who is admitted to practice in South Carolina may designate secure leave periods as provided by this order, during which that lawyer is protected from *appearing* in a *trial, hearing, or other court proceeding*").
