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Ms. Evans-Pryor:

Thank you so much. I am overjoyed that the Court may consider my replacement pleading.

I am trying to determine how to accomplish the kind of indigency pleading you mentioned, but if I can't, I'll get you the filing fees somehow.

One of the things God told me to file is a lawsuit against a scrapyard over essentially what I consider conversion of a vehicle whose registration was first stolen from us by these same ISIS participants. I was led to file that related lawsuit in order to get my expenses for this matter.

I was rushing to finish the 70 or so pages of complicated pleadings and evidence, which includes multimedia evidence, yesterday. The matter could not be condensed further because of its complexity.

I wrote an entire paragraph about why I redacted so many identifiers on the bill that illustrates a 2022 telephone call to the scrapyard. One of the reasons was because I don't even want my opponents knowing what model phone I had or have. The reason I don't want them knowing about my devices that is that I've been hacked on at least 4 devices by opponents and didn't want to help anyone along with any similar malfeasance. Hopefully I will be able to afford better security soon and this will no longer be a concern.

I would rather this not be filed as a pleading, but wanted to let you know about the status and redaction scenario. I understand if you must do so.
