Take 1 tablet (5 mg) by mouth 2 (two) times a day Do not start before December 13, 2023.

cholecalciferol (vitamin D3) 5,000 unit tablet Take 5,000 Units by mouth daily

Crestor 10 MG tablet
Generic drug: rosuvastatin

Take 10 mg by mouth nightly

cyclobenzaprine 10 mg tablet
Commonly known as: FLEXERIL


Take 10 mg by mouth at bedtime as needed for muscle spasms

dextroamphetamine-amphetamine 20 mg
Commonly known as: ADDERALL

Take 10 mg by mouth 2 (two) times a day

magnesium oxide 400 mg (241.3 mg magnesium) tablet
Commonly known as: MAG-OX

Take 400 mg by mouth daily
