I'm working on my Reply Brief and unfortunately I have to use the final transcript you approved that has errors you should have corrected.

On page 20, Line 5-8 the transcript reads:

"- - - the movant may not present only the portions of the record supporting it's position while knowingly admitting evidence to the contrary that may raise a genuine issue of material fact."

I was reading the statement from a law reference during the hearing so I know the word I said was "omitting" not "admitting" which I asked be corrected on my formal request to your office

I believe there was tampering with the transcript by your office and in addition to you not correcting the errors when you reviewed them, Julie Cendroski was substituted for the designated court reporter and had to redo it several times because of multiple errors she made. I was not able to get a copy of the audio of the transcript because I had to request permission from Judge Bentley Price, the presiding judge, and of course he never responded to my request. He was removed by the South Carolina Bar on October 6, 2023 due to a mark he received for reputation.

Pet Helpers, Inc, has abused civil process in this lawsuit aided by their attorney Stephan Futeral, the courts and its administrative offices. That will all be exposed in the current appeal or when I file a separate lawsuit for abuse of civil process and name all the parties that were involved.

During the Nuremberg Trials of Nazi war criminals, defendants tried to use the defense that their supervisors had ordered them to commit the crimes and that didn't work then and it won't work now.
