



MOTION TO RECALL REMITTITUR

Petitioner respectfully moves the honorable Court for an order to recall the remittitur, permitting him to enter a Motion to Reconsider, to protect his rights under the 14th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States of America - due process, which includes the right to be heard, among other things, and equal protection of the laws.
