STANDARD CONDITIONS OF PROBATION

1. I shall report in person to the South Carolina Department of Probation, Parole and Pardon Services' office on the day of my sentencing or release, and as instructed by the Department; and I shall make complete and truthful reports to the Agent.
2. I shall not change my residence or employment without the consent of my Agent. Further, I shall allow my Agent to visit me in my home, at my place of employment, or elsewhere, at any time.
3. I shall not use controlled substances, except when properly prescribed by a licensed physician, nor consume alcoholic beverages to excess, nor enter establishments whose primary business is the sale and drinking of alcoholic beverages. Further, I shall submit to a urinalysis, blood test or provide forensic evidence when instructed by Agents of the Department, and I agree that any of these test results may be used as evidence in any hearing for the violation of the conditions of my supervision.
4. I shall not possess or purchase any firearms or other dangerous weapons, and I shall not associate with any person who has a criminal record, or any other person whom my Agent has instructed me to avoid.
5. I shall work diligently at a lawful occupation. Further, I shall notify my Agent if I become unemployed.
6. I shall not violate any Federal, State, or Local Law, and I shall immediately contact my Agent if I am ever arrested or questioned by a law enforcement official for any reason whatsoever.
7. I shall pay a supervision fee and any other fees as determined by the Department.
8. I shall not leave the State without permission from my Agent. Further, if I am ever arrested in another state for violating these conditions, I hereby irrevocably waive all extradition rights I may otherwise have been entitled to and agree to return to South Carolina when directed by my Agent, the Court or by a warrant.
9. I shall obey all conditions of supervision set forth in this order including the payment of fines, restitution or other payments, and the service of any period of incarceration.
10. I shall follow the advice and instructions of my Agent and I agree to comply with any further conditions imposed by the Department or its Agents.
11. I agree to pay restitution and a statutory collection fee payable to the Department of Probation, Parole, and Pardon Services as directed by Agents of the Department. (20% collection fee charged)
12. Unless I was convicted of or pled guilty or nolo contendere to a Class C misdemeanor or an unclassified misdemeanor that carries a term of imprisonment of not more than one year, I shall be subject to a search or seizure, without a search warrant, based on reasonable suspicions, of my person, any vehicle I own or am driving, and any of my possessions by: (1) any probation agent employed by the Department; or (2) any other law enforcement officer.



If requested, you will also have an opportunity to confront and cross-examine any witnesses called to testify against you; however, the Department may elect to present affidavits of witnesses or police officers in lieu of testimony. If you are released on bond prior to your hearing date, you must report to the Probation Office immediately upon your release.

You are required to be present at your hearing as scheduled above. If you do not appear, a bench warrant or a failure to appear warrant will be issued for your arrest. P R O C E E D I N G S

August 3, 2023

(All parties were present with counsel when the following proceedings were had:)

(The Defendant was duly sworn.)

THE COURT: All right. Probation, do you want to go forward?

AGENT JONES: Yes, sir, Your Honor. This is Mr. Kenneth Parker. He's on probation for financial transaction card theft, five years suspended to five years of probation. He does have a -- one prior matter in the case, current violation, and he's failed to pay -- failed to make contact with the Department since he was sentenced 12/8/22, failed to report from SCDC on or about 1/ -- January 16th 2023, failed to make contact with the Department, failed to have a valid residence plan.

THE COURT: Okay. And does the Department have a recommendation?

MR. FINCH: Yes, sir, Your Honor. A recommendation of full.

THE COURT: Okay. Mr. McCann, I'd be glad to hear from you.

MS. MCCANN: Thank you, Your Honor. Your Honor, Kenny had admitted that he had violated his probation. There's some mitigation involved in this however. He is

1 very attached to his children. And his wife accused him of
2 criminal domestic violence and he lost custody and access to
3 his children and it's really tore him up. His whole life
4 he talks with great passion about his relationship with his
5 children.

6 She had subsequently left her second husband and
7 abandoned the children and this has really, really bothered
8 him. He's homeless; so he doesn't have a stable
9 environment in order to assume custody of them. And this
10 has bothered him to get on -- you know, get on his feet and
11 get something done.

12 His mother died in addition this year. So
13 everything's kind of snowballed in his life.

14 He's 48 years of age. He has an eleventh grade
15 education. He did get his GED and about a year and a half
16 in college studying business management. He tells me that
17 he's been clean for about a year from any drugs and
18 alcohol, however he does suffer from being homeless and
19 dealing with all these issues in his life.

20 Since he's been in the jail -- and this has been
21 a really good thing for him -- since he got locked up for
22 this probation violation, there's gentleman who goes to the
23 jail on a regular basis to help inmates with job skills and
24 providing opportunities for him. He has provided him an
25 opportunity to go to Florida for a roofing job. He's also

1 provided him with all of the information and access to
2 housing there and how to get food there. He is hoping that
3 he won't have to be dumpster diving anymore, that he won't
4 -- as far as means for food, that he'll have a stable
5 environment. Perhaps he'll be able to -- to regain his
6 relationship with his children. There's nothing he can do
7 as far as his relationship with his mom because she did
8 pass away this year.

9 Should he have been doing what he's supposed to
10 on probation? Absolutely, Your Honor. However, he has had
11 a lot of things going on in his life. He's been very
12 frustrated with it. He doesn't have the coping skills that
13 perhaps you or I may have. He's made very poor decisions.

14 He's been in jail for 67 days, Your Honor. My
15 client would ask the Court for -- to give him credit for
16 time served or 90 days revocation, terminate his probation,
17 allow him to go to Florida and take advantage of this
18 opportunity he has. He doesn't owe any restitution.
19 There's no issue of that. So he would like to be able to
20 take advantage of the opportunity in Florida.

21 THE COURT: The one problem I see with that, Ms.
22 McCann, he just was put on probation back in December. And
23 so he hadn't been on probation very long and, you know, if
24 we go along with your suggestion, I mean, it's just kind of
25 a slap on the wrist and again, okay, go on.

1 Does the Department have any suggestion with
2 respect to Ms. McCann's position?

3 MR. FINCH: We are opposed to that, Your Honor.
4 Mr. Parker's history -- and I did misspeak when I first
5 started my motion. He didn't have a prior violation on
6 this case.

7 THE COURT: All right.

8 MR. FINCH: It was a prior with the previous case
9 that he got revoked on that. So when I looked up at my
10 note I saw the prior revocation and not the prior violation
11 on this actual offense here. This offense -- he just
12 served an 18-month revocation with our Department. He got
13 sentenced on a new case in December, gotten out of jail.
14 And never reported to us to start. He doesn't have a very
15 good history of reporting and making contact with our
16 Department. And I'm afraid if he was to go to Florida that
17 he would not return.

18 MS. MCCANN: That's why we would be asking for a
19 termination, so we wouldn't have to worry about him
20 returning.

21 THE COURT: All right. I'm going to revoke 30
22 months, terminate probation. Time will satisfy any and all
23 outstanding or future financial obligations. Good luck to
24 you.

25 MS. MCCANN: Gets credit for his 67 days?

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THE COURT: Right. And credit for 67 days.

MS. MCCANN: Thank you, Your Honor.
