ORDER

Because you are represented by counsel, we are returning your filings to you. See *Miller v. State*, 388 S.C. 347, 697 S.E.2d 527, 527 (2010) ("Since there is no right to 'hybrid representation' that is partially pro se and partially by counsel, substantive documents, with the exception of motions to relieve counsel, filed pro se by a person represented by counsel are not to be accepted unless submitted by counsel.").

However, the Court has considered the contents of the motion as a response to your attorney's letter advising you of his guilty plea explanation pursuant to Rule 203(d)(1)(B)(iv) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules.

Jeremy Reed has failed to provide the Court with a written explanation showing there is an issue which can be reviewed on appeal, as required by Rule 203(d)(1)(B)(iv) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules (SCACR).
