

ORDER

Respondents moved for an order to direct Appellant to serve and file a record on appeal containing all matters designated by the parties or to dismiss this appeal. Appellant filed a return and a supplemental record on appeal. Respondents filed a reply, stating the record was incomplete because neither the record on appeal nor the supplemental record on appeal included the "[a]ffidavits of service of summons and complaint from 2013" designated by Respondents.¹ After careful consideration, we deny Respondents' motion to dismiss. However, Appellant shall serve and file a second supplemental record on appeal containing the affidavits of service of summons and complaint from 2013 within twenty days of the date of this order.
