Jennifer,

I interviewed Jordan Hart at the jail this week. What she told me consistent with what she told Culbertson when she was interviewed at the ACSO. She did tell me that she believed she had warrants out for her arrest that night which is why she ran. This is different from her recorded statement, which was she didn't want Chevis to be alone. (I think.) She says she is willing to testify truthfully at trial if called.

The case has been reassigned to Inv. Scotty Hill, since Culbertson is now with the city. I met with him to compare what I had received vs. what exists. The following are the issues I found:

DNA lab report from Greenville County – Chevis gave a sample in Feb. 2017, the evidence was sent in June 2017 and has been returned to ACSO – Hill is requesting the report from Greenville  
Madison Williams – gave a statement but not in case file I received – Hill will obtain statement  
Wesley Cromer - gave a statement but not in case file I received – Hill will obtain statement  
Jonathon Lecroy - gave a statement but not in case file I received – Hill will obtain statement  
Abbeville 911 call/CAD from Keowee Rd. (Cromer or Lecroy) Hill will determine if preserved and obtain if exists  
Security video from 214 Russell Dr. – not in evidence – Hill will determine if preserved and obtain if it exists  
GSR kits are pending at SLED. I will ask to be expedited.

I told Inv. Hill these items were needed ASAP. Hopefully I will have them to you by the end of next week. (GSR excepted)

As to an offer: The family is opposed to me making an offer. They want to ask for life in prison (wanted me to make this a capital case actually). I don't think I will ever get them to come off the murder charge. If I could get them to a recommendation of 30, would your client plead? If he is not willing to plead to murder, I don't think we can work this out, unless some problem with the case exposes itself as we prepare to dispose of the case, that will allow me to justify it to the family.

You probably already know this but Jennifer Poore was Bob Lusk's stepdaughter. Her mother Kathy Lusk worked in the courthouse. We may have to get an out of town Judge to hear the case.
