## ORDER

---

This appeal arises out of an order of the circuit court denying the appellant's motions to disqualify Respondent's counsel, for a protective order, and to dismiss. This appeal is dismissed as not immediately appealable. *See EnerSys Delaware, Inc. v. Hopkins*, 401 S.C. 615, 619, 738 S.E.2d 478, 480 (2013) (holding an order denying a motion to disqualify an attorney is not immediately appealable); *Grossheusch v. Cramer*, 377 S.C. 12, 30, 659 S.E.2d 112, 122 (2008) (noting discovery orders are generally interlocutory and are not immediately appealable because they do not involve the merits of the action or affect a substantial right); *McLendon v. S.C. Dep't of Highways & Pub. Transp.*, 313 S.C. 525, 526, 443 S.E.2d 539, 540 (1994) (holding the denial of a motion to dismiss is generally not immediately appealable). The remittitur will be sent as provided by Rule 221(b), SCACR.
