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Lee:

I'm not lead counsel on this, so I will defer to Rob Varnado. I was brought on board solely for the purpose of trying to negotiate a settlement with the Horry County Council.

However, having said that, I certainly "invested" in the matter and want to see the Court reach the right result.

With that in mind, based on my prior experience in such matters, I would suggest to you that repeated inquiries to the Court about the status of this case are not helpful to our cause.

I've previously advised in at least two responses, the same information which is in the Court's correspondence below, which is also not the first time they've responded to the inquiry. The status is:

- the case has been submitted
- it will be decided on the briefs
- there will not be any oral argument scheduled on the case
- the next communication from the Court we receive will likely be their ruling

It's possible they might ask for something else, but I expect we'll see a ruling next.

A good rule of thumb to keep in mind - if you're causing the Court to have to do more work that they otherwise would not have to do, chances are very good that what you're doing is not helping your case.

I can't think of anything else we can do to expedite matters or further encourage the court to the right result. I think the case is in "set it and forget it" mode right now - the best thing we can do is

wait.
