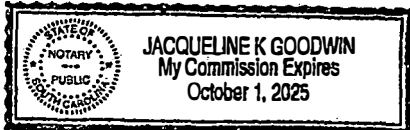
**NOTICE OF CONSTITUTIONAL
QUESTIONS**

Pursuant of rule 5.1. Constitutional challenge to a statute: Federal rules of civil procedures

1. Which jurisdiction is this court of appeals operating under, is it the common law (laws of the land) or is it Maritime jurisdiction (the laws of the sea)?
2. Are the laws the Appellant is accused of offending enacted by constitutionally qualified persons?
3. Are the court's judicial and executive officers constitutionally qualified to prosecute and adjudicate the laws of South Carolina? Considering none of the orders given in this case have a combination of; a judge's name, a judge's title, a judge's signature, and state seal provided on them? Pursuant of **18 USC § 505- Seals of courts; signatures of judges or court officers**
4. If a corporation intentionally & maliciously initiates the process of foreclosure without lawful standings on jurisdiction of subject matter, (no lawful contract, without the mortgage & original promissory note complete with the wet ink signature of both parties) is it not considered to be a malicious process?

5. Is it considered collusion if a corporation maliciously initiates the process of foreclosure without the proper documentation (mortgage & note), and a judge sides with the fraudulent corporation without proper evidence of lawful standing on jurisdiction of subject matter, despite appellant providing overwhelming evidence of his innocence & lawful evidence of ownership. Would the combination of these acts be considered collusion?

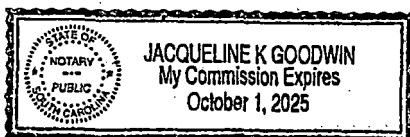
