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**MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE APPELLANTS' RETURN TO MOTION TO DISMISS APPEAL**

1. Counsel for Appellant is in receipt of Respondents' Motion to Dismiss Appeal which, on information and belief, was filed and served on or about May 29, 2024.
2. The time for filing Appellant's Return to Respondent's Motion to Dismiss was previously extended to July 1, 2024 based on Counsel for Appellant's medical condition. Specifically, Counsel suffers acute bilateral allergic reaction conjunctivitis which, to date, continues cause the undersigned to suffer vision loss due to extensive corneal scarring. Although the condition continues to improve, Counsel's ability to conduct computer work remains limited and has caused a substantial backlog in Counsel's work.
3. Although Counsel has not fully recovered from the corneal scarring and continues to have significantly decreased vision, the condition is improving. However, Counsel has not recovered at the rate previously anticipated and remains under doctor's care for the treatment of Counsels medical condition.
4. In order to facilitate Counsel's ability to manage the backlog caused by Counsel's injury, Counsel has retained the temporary services of a transcriptionist to assist in the completion of certain tasks requiring significant computer work, to include Appellant's return to Respondent's Motion to Dismiss.
5. Due to the circumstances set forth above, Counsel for Appellant requests an additional extension of time to file the Appellant's Return to the Motion to Dismiss until July 21, 2024.
6. This is Appellant's second motion for an extension of time to Respond to the Motion to Dismiss and, if the extension is granted, Counsel does not anticipate the need for any additional enlargement of time for purposes of responding to the Motion.
7. This motion is not being made for purposes of delay; rather, Counsel's ongoing medical issue has necessitated the request for enlargement of time.
8. Appellant also requests that all other deadlines applicable to the perfection of this appeal be held in abeyance pending the Court's ruling on this motion.

Accordingly, Appellant requests an extension of time until July 21, 2024 to file and serve the Appellant's Return to Respondent's Motion to Dismiss.
