


## ORDER

On July 9, 2024, we dismissed this appeal because Appellant failed to provide a sufficient guilty plea explanation as required by Rule 203(d)(1)(B)(iv) of the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules. On July 12, 2024, this court received a letter from Appellant, in which he stated multiple reasons why he believed his appeal should be allowed to proceed. Then, on July 18, 2024, this court received a letter from Appellant, which we construe as a petition to rehear the dismissal. After careful consideration of Appellant's letters received on July 12, 2024, and July 18, 2024, the court is unable to discover that any material fact or principle of law has been either overlooked or disregarded, and hence, there is no basis for granting a rehearing.
