PETITION FOR EXTENSION TO FILE  
INITIAL BRIEF OF APPELLANT  
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER IN THIS **POOL CASE**

Counsel filed the initial brief of appellant and designation of matter in the case of State v. Matthew Fullbright with this Court on July 16, 2013. Counsel filed the petition for rehearing in the case of State v. Bobby Alexander Gilbert in this Court on July 11, 2013. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari, the Johnson petition

for writ of certiorari pursuant to Austin v. State and accompanying appendix in the case of Michael Miller v. State with the Supreme Court on July 11, 2013. Counsel filed the petition for writ of certiorari and accompanying appendix in the case of Anthony Sanders v. The State of South Carolina with the Supreme Court on July 5, 2013.

3. This request is made in good faith, and not for purposes of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.


4. As indicated by his consent below, counsel for the state graciously consents to or does not oppose this request.


