ORDER

On July 15, 2024, this court wrote to Appellant, explaining she must serve and file her amended initial brief and designation of matter within thirty days. Therefore, she was required to serve and file these documents on or before August 14, 2024. *See* Rule 263(a), SCACR (explaining that in the appellate courts, intermediate Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays are excluded from the computation of time only when the period of time prescribed or allowed is less than seven days). When Appellant failed to do so, this court dismissed her appeal on August 19, 2024. *See* Rule 260(a), SCACR (allowing for dismissal when an appellant fails to comply with an order of the appellate court). On August 20, 2024, Appellant filed a motion to reinstate, arguing her initial brief and designation of matter were not due yet. Appellant contends the computation for time does not include intermediate Saturdays, Sundays, or holidays. Respondent filed a return, opposing Appellant's motion to reinstate because Appellant failed to serve and file her amended initial brief and designation of matter timely. Appellant filed a reply, reiterating her earlier arguments.

After careful consideration, we grant Appellant's motion to reinstate. Appellant's amended initial brief filed on August 23, 2024, and her amended designation of matter filed on August 26, 2024, are accepted as filed at this time. We take this opportunity to note that for matters governed by the South Carolina Appellate Court Rules in computing any period of time prescribed or allowed *intermediate*

Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays are *included* unless the time prescribed or allowed is less than seven days. *See* Rule 263(a), SCACR.
