

On August 22, 2024, counsel filed the return to the petition for rehearing in In the Matter of the Care and Treatment of Andy Eugene Hyman with the Court of Appeals. On August 21, 2024, counsel filed the brief of appellant, designation of matter, and record on appeal in The State v. Seuvarrgio Rector with the Court of Appeals.

3. This request is made in good faith, and not for purposes of delay. Counsel intends to continue to work on the cases with more than three extensions first so that the caseload will hopefully become more manageable in the near future, and less extensions will need to be requested.

4. On August 30, 2024, opposing counsel, the Attorney General's Office, graciously consented to this extension request by way of general consent granted in writing, by Deputy Attorney General Donald J. Zelenka for all Appellate Defense extensions through September 30, 2024.

WHEREFORE, the undersigned counsel would respectfully request a thirty-day extension. Counsel respectfully requests that the time limits for filing the Initial Brief of Appellant and Designation of Matter be held in abeyance pending a ruling on this motion.
