



ORDER

On August 15, 2024, this court dismissed this appeal due to an insufficient basis to allow the appeal of a guilty plea to proceed. *See* Rule 203(d)(1)(B)(iv), SCACR. On August 30, 2024, this court received an explanation from Appellant providing the reasons he believed his appeal should be allowed to proceed. We construe Appellant's explanation as a petition for rehearing. After careful consideration of the petition for rehearing, the court is unable to discover that any material fact or principle of law has been either overlooked or disregarded, and hence, there is no basis for granting a rehearing. Accordingly, the petition for rehearing is denied.
