**NOTICE OF APPEAL – PROBATE COURT  
IN THE MATTER OF: ELLIOTT PALMER – DECEDENT  
Case # 2022 ES40 01762**

I pray that you will grant my request to reconsider/reinstate my appeal of the Probate case referenced above. Nothing about this case was handled fairly or justly. Justice would not be served if it were to stand as it is. I am one of Elliott's daughters who was not given the opportunity to have any say so in my father's care, affairs or when it came to his estate. My only fault in this matter was trusting the wrong people, who gave me the wrong advice because I was prevented and unable to get legal representation. why shouldn't I have trusted my sister Renee, who said she would take care of everything, that I didn't need to get a lawyer because she already had one and that she was fighting for me and my niece, although I wasn't agreeable to my niece, his granddaughter, since he had many grandchildren, she said she had to be put in the will because it was a state law, until I found out otherwise, why shouldn't I have trusted the clerks at the Probate court or there supervisors or even the Judge, whom I wrote numerous letters to stating the problems I was faced with, and why shouldn't I have trusted the aunt, by marriage (Henrietta Palmer) who acted as though she had my best interest at heart, by telling me they attempted to exclude me in my fathers will (which they did in the first, unsigned one), giving me Judge Belton's phone number to contact her, and asking me if I would be okay with just my three sister's receiving my father's inheritance, never mentioning that she, her husband Bobby Palmer, and her son Michael Palmer, were in the will as well as his girlfriend Laverne. Or my sister's attorney who, cleverly absolved himself of any attachment to me and representing me during the mediation hearing, therefore, having only my sisters' best interest in mind versus mine and my niece's. I am a service connected disabled USAF veteran who was taken advantage of just like my father who had Dementia.

The moment the decision was made, I went to the Probate Court and notified them of my intention to appeal and stated the reasons why – because of the fact that I had no say so and all of the injustices I experienced during this process (being prevented from getting an attorney, told not to get one, lies told by Henrietta, Renee and the probate court and all the physical, mental and emotional harm I was caused to prevent me from fighting, I was also involuntarily committed to the VA and Prisma Health Care System Psychiatric ward on two separate occasions, once ordered by Judge Mccullouch – who I intend to file a ODC complaint against, I notified the Police of my intent to protest outside the probate court against the Judge and the probate court, after being assaulted by my uncle, and this was what I got in return – two involuntary hospital stays, all this to make me look crazy and incompetent and to keep me from fighting). I then went to the Office of Disciplinary Counsel and filed a complaint against Judge

Belton, whom I believe should have recused herself, because of the various conversations with family members and the advice she gave them. I don't believe judges are allowed to do this and sign an order that would legally stand. I believed what I was told because I have her phone number and called her house but was unable to speak with her because, according to her daughter, she was out of town. I truly believed Judge Belton would have been found guilty and the appeal would not be necessary, because here decision would be overturned but I continued to seek legal assistance to no avail. I also thought that giving all this information to Ms. Erica Williams at the ODC would be sufficient. I'm not an attorney but had I not been lied to, taken advantage of, and prevented from getting one, the outcome obviously would have been different. My father was taken advantage of and so was I. He had Dementia and I am a disabled veteran doing the best I can under the circumstances, to get the justice we deserve.

They've all lived very well, but I have not and not by choice. Bobby, Henrietta, and Michael, lived well by stealing my fathers money and bragging about, Renee lived well by not having to pay a mortgage, rent or taxes for 46 years in a house she lived in brought by our father, Rosetta lived well by living in a house my father brought for my mom in New Jersey, along with her son for 25 years paying no mortgage, rent or taxes and Laverne lived well by leaching off my father, who refused to marry her, for years. She was able to keep a home in Atlanta, while staying with my father, and cars were given to her. She lived free and well. I wasn't even allowed to stay in my father's home when I drove down from California for his funeral, yet she was not and is not his wife. She signed checks that were made out to him, illegally, she was not his fiduciary or his wife, she should be grateful no one prosecuted her for this instead of trying to get his children's money and being given more than me if this order is allowed to stand. Isn't obvious why he didn't marry her? I believe she took a lot more from him. And since when does a girlfriend have rights. He didn't marry her for a reason, obvious reasons, she lived well while he was alive. And then there's Aliyah, who was raised by my parents and never had to want for anything except the love of her mother, which my mother and father tried to provide, she's a granddaughter not a daughter. And lastly, there's me, daddy's little girl – favorite girl, who loved and admired him so very much. We spent a lot of time together when I was growing up. I was the youngest and was always interested in what he did, I always wanted to be underfoot, and accomplish what he accomplished, he took me on jobs, taught me how to drive, took us out to eat and to amusement parks in Coney Island, just to name a few things, I admired my dad and what he had accomplished and tried to follow in his footsteps by starting my own businesses although they did not come to fruition, my entrance exam when I applied at Rutgers in Newark requested I write about someone I admired and I chose my dad. He was proud when I went to college. He knew he never really had to worry about me because I was the self sufficient one, I never had a since of entitlement to his money until now. I basically always paid my way and he confided in me in ways he never did with the others. I hit a downward spiral and suffered homelessness, I was cut off from my father by his girlfriend and family members. They changed his number and Renee changed hers, which made it hard for me to keep in touch or contact him, I suffered and so did he. I should have been allowed to be there when he got sick but I was not, when he needed care, but I was not. They could have solved both our problems, him needing a caregiver and me needing a home. I ask you where was there love for me? Where was there love for him? Depriving him of the daughter he loved and depriving me of the father I loved and missed. What hurts the most, is that I only get to see pictures and videos when I should have been there for the real thing.

Please reconsider and reinstate my right to appeal, buy doing so you are making sure that not just me and my father get the justice we deserve but that others who suffer from dementia, Alzheimer's or any other disabilities are not taken advantage of as well and that they get the justice they deserve.

I pray you'll find in my favor and grant this request,

Please keep in mind I was forced into two involuntary commitments during this time, one signed by Judge McCullouch , I was prevented from getting legal assistance, I was not getting my mail or getting it in a timely fashion, it was sent to my sister's house, I was homeless for a period of time in South Carolina, forced to stay in hotels and caused a great deal of harm.
