

## ORDER

---

This appeal was dismissed on September 12, 2024, because Appellant failed to show that he had made satisfactory arrangements to pay for the January 31, 2022 or July 19, 2022 transcripts or file the second supplemental record on appeal. Appellant has now filed a petition for rehearing and proof he has received the January 31, 2022 transcript. We reinstate the appeal. However, within ten days of the date of this order Appellant shall provide this court with proof he has made satisfactory arrangements to pay for the July 19, 2022 transcript. *See* Rule 207(a)(1) ("Where a transcript of the proceeding must be prepared by the court reporter, appellant shall, within the time provided for ordering the transcript, make satisfactory arrangements (including agreement regarding payment for the transcript), in writing with the court reporter for furnishing the transcript. . . . Appellant shall contemporaneously furnish all parties, the Office of Court Administration, and the clerk of the appellate court with copies of all correspondence with the court reporter."); Rule 207(a)(2), SCACR ("The court reporter shall transcribe and deliver the transcript to appellant no later than sixty (60) days after the date of the request."); Rule 207(a)(5), SCACR ("If appellant has not received the transcript within the allotted time nor received notification of an extension within ten (10) days after the allotted time, appellant shall notify the Office of Court Administration, the clerk of the appellate court, and the court reporter in writing."). The second supplemental record on appeal—which should contain the transcripts from January 31, 2022 and July 19, 2022—is due twenty days from receipt of the July 19, 2022 transcript. Failure to comply will result in

the dismissal of this appeal.
