**MOTION FOR THIRD EXTENSION OF TIME WITHIN WHICH  
TO SERVE AND FILE INITIAL BRIEF OF RESPONDENT  
AND DESIGNATION OF MATTER**

Respondent (“the State”), through its undersigned counsel, would respectfully show unto the Court as follows:

1. The Initial Brief of Respondent and Designation of Matter are due to be served and filed on October 10, 2024, pursuant to two previous extensions granted by the Court.

2. Pursuant to RE: Extension Requests in Criminal Direct Appeals and Post-Conviction Relief Certiorari Proceedings: Order of the South Carolina Supreme Court dated March 18, 2009, the State moves for a **third** extension in the above-referenced criminal appeal and asks for an additional thirty days to complete the brief in this case.

3. Counsel submits this extension request is supported by good cause and is not intended for purposes of delay. Counsel is working on the Brief in this case and intends to have it finished in a timely manner. However, the undersigned counsel has not yet been able to finish the

Brief due to a heavy workload. Counsel also has supervisory duties over a section in the Attorney General's office that have required substantial attention in the past several months. Accordingly, in order to ensure the Brief is properly researched and prepared, counsel would therefore request an additional extension of time within which to serve and file the Brief.


